Remember When?

Remember the wonderous works that he has done, his miracles and the judgments he uttered, O offspring of Israel his servant, sons of Jacob, his chosen ones!

1 Chronicles 16:12-13

From time to time a notification will pop up on my cell phone prompting me to look at a picture that I had taken some time ago. It usually comes with a catchy title and an indication of when the picture was taken, such as "A special memory... One year ago," or "Revisit the moment...Four months ago today," or "Remember when...Five years ago." These are photos that the Google Photos algorithm thinks I would be interested in looking at again. I'm sure you have several such photos on your phone or around your house.

Photos give us a visual reminder of special people, places and events in our lives. How did people survive before you could take all the photos you wanted and have them with you in your pocket or purse at all times? How could people remember anything before the invention of the camera? My opinion is that the world would be a better place and people would be much better off without the ability to take "selfies," but that's just my opinion. Whether it involves pictures or not, it is important for us to remember our past and the grace of God that has been with us every step of the way.


The Bible often urges God's people to remember the past. Remember his mighty acts. Remember his covenant. Remember his promises. Do this in remembrance of me. This kind of remembering is not just a test of memory. It is a reminder of the ongoing benefits of God's past actions for his people in the present. Remember his mighty acts because that's who your God is today. Remember his covenant because that's what makes you his people. Remember his promises because they are for you. Do this in remembrance of me because the benefits Christ's death and resurrection are brought to you here and now in bread and wine.

This past Sunday we were blessed to celebrate Holy Baptism and the Rite of Confirmation at the 10:30 service. Afterwards there was the traditional "photo shoot." The confirmands patiently put up with all the photos their family and friends wanted to take, while the baby was photographed until he became fussy. (Or was it the other way around? The confirmands were on the verge of tears and the baby endured it all patiently. I don't remember.) Perhaps in years to come these photos will help these young people remember this important day in their faith life and be shown to the baby when Google Photos algorithm prompts his parents to remember the day five years from now. If so, that will be a good thing.



What Do You Want?



One of the best-known and most-beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pas-tures and still waters).

We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the busi-ness of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word.

Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep.

The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.

Message from the Board President

Now that the 2023 budget is finalized, the Board and I are working on ways to pay off the rest of the roof loan. As of May, the church still owes about \$30,000 on the loan. The church has oil stocks that will be cashed in soon with approximate value around \$18,000. That will leave Hope with around \$12,000 to come up with.

As of now the roof payments are coming from money that was given to us by Troy School. We are discussing how much money to leave in there for when the parking lot needs to be recoated. Also, Hope has been blessed by members who are donating to the roof fund which has lowered the unfunded amount. This means that by the next meeting the unfunded amount may be less. THANKS to all who have donated to the roof fund.

At the next board meeting, we will figure out how to pay the last couple of payments! If you have any ideas on how to pay the rest of the loan please let me know.

Until then, get outside and enjoy the warm and sunshine days of Summer!
