We Lutherans love our acronyms. Let me give just a few examples: LSB (Lutheran Service Book). LWML (Lutheran Women's Missionary League). LCMS (Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod). LLL (Lutheran Laymen's League). LCC (Lutheran Church Charities). NID (Northern Illinois District) Acronyms help us to communicate quickly and concisely, although they can be a bit confusing to the uninitiated.


I like using acronyms in my teaching too. If you've taken a class or Bible study with me you might have heard me use acronyms such as G.R.A.C.E (God's Riches At Christ's Expense as a definition for grace). S.O.S. (Shows our Sin/Shows our Savior to teach about Law and Gospel). A.C.T.S. (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication to teach about different types of prayers). I'm sure there are many more in my repertoire.

It's not just Lutherans in general or me in particular who love their acronyms. Christians have long used them to convey pithy sayings such as the famous WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?) And others like J.O.Y (Jesus first, Others next, Yourself last). Recently, I've had a constant reminder of another cute acronym F.R.O.G. (Fully Rely On God.) As people who constantly struggle with doubts and uncertainties, we need to be constantly reminded to Fully Rely On God. He is certainly worthy of our trust.

The reason why I've been thinking of that acronym lately is because over the last few months I have noticed that little frogs have mysteriously shown up in random places around the church. At first, I thought some child lost their little toy. When it wasn't reclaimed, I picked it up and threw it out. Then I saw another one. Then another. I collected them and threw them away too. It wasn't long before they showed up again, but in different places. That's when I realized something must be going on. Since then, I've left them where they were placed. But I couldn't stop wondering who might have placed them there and why.



Define Your Life by How You Give



Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away.

Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us cit-izens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and mak-ing a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relation-ships with friends and family, with neighbors and coworkers, and with the Lord. It shifts our fo-cus from asking the question, "How can I be a friend, family member, neighbor and servant to others," to asking the question, "What have they done for me lately?" We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and be-come more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is



the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

So even though summer is here, things are still happening at church. The first item the board is dealing with is the church music. With the passing of Hope's great organist Lee Maloney, for the first time in many years the church organ is silent. For the time being, recorded church music is being used to get us by. But it's time to find a long term solution. It would be great to find a new organist, but the shortage of organists keeps growing. When Hope bought this new organ a few years ago, Lee our organist, made sure that it had many upgrades. One feature that will help Hope immensely, is a recording feature on it. That techie feature will allow us to record hymns and the liturgical services as well. SO finding an organist(s) who will come in and record is our next task. When all is recorded, which is going to take some time, the organ will once play the heavenly music!

Next, in the Fall, Hope will be participating in one of the LCMS *re: Vitality* resources called CADD. It stands for Congregational Assessment of Development/Decline Status. This 95 question survey, in which the whole congregation participates, is designed to objectively answer the question: "Where are we...really?" This will help the board and Pastor figure out where we are now and what direction to go in the future. More details will be coming in the next few weeks. Until then, enjoy the rest of the summer!
