


The youth will serve a soup and sandwich supper following this service. Free will donation for the supper and the money that is collected will go towards their National Youth Gathering trip this coming summer.





"And He shall be their peace" Micah 5:5

Peace. When you read and speak this word, it seems to have a calming affect on you, doesn't it? You hear this word when people speak of peace at Christmas. Conflicts and expressions of hatred seem out of place during the season of Advent and Christmas. Instead many of us see peace as expressions of love and compassion, hope, joy and singing during this time of families gathering together and exchanging gifts to each other.

We look forward to Christmas and then we feel down when it passes, because this season provides us a needed rest from daily

stress in our lives. This peace that we hold close to us at Christmas provides us strength to deal with our daily struggles and suppresses our fear of death.

Micah, who wrote the verse that is quoted above, wrote his bible passages around 700 years before Jesus was born. He prophesied to the people of Israel the time when the Lord will gather His faithful people and reign over them as King. At the time when he wrote this, God's people were facing invasion by a foreign ar-

my. God reminded His people that they had sinned and turned away from His will and His love, that they had neglected to worship Him alone and love their neighbor. The strife they faced was not only the result of foreign invasion, but also the result of their own sin. It isn't surprising that what he wrote mirrors very much our present-day society, is it?

Today we face struggles from the evil and hatred all around us. We also face the reality of our own sin and its consequences, including death. We ruin relationships, we fail to love others as God commands us to do, we often leave people hurt from their interactions with us. These all result from our own imperfect lives and remind us that we are broken. The world presses in on us and it causes us anxiety and fear.

Micah's Old Testament promise is the same for you today. Peace is found in the one sent by God to be the Savior. His name is Jesus, and He is God's own Son in human flesh. His death and resurrection paid for all



sin and earned eternal life for all who believe in Him. Jesus' love gives peace to all who trust in Him. Christmas is the time of peace and joy, singing and laughing, all because of Jesus. This is the Good News of the Gospel and the TRUE MEANING of Christmas.

You have many opportunities to experience peace, joy, love, singing and fellowship during this Advent and Christmas season. The St. John's Sunday school children will present their Christmas program on Wednesday, December 15th at 6:00 p.m. We will also have our Christmas Eve worship services at 5:00 p.m. for the Family Service and at 9:00 p.m. for the Candlelight Service. You also are invited to worship with us each Sunday at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. for worship. Please join us for fellowship, together in person, at St. John's. We invite those who normally watch our services online to participate in-person in fellowship together, experiencing the peace that only God can give us.

From both Karis and I – we pray for God's blessings to be upon all of you and that you truly receive the peace that surpasses all understanding, keeping your heart and mind in Christ Jesus not only during this season, but all year 'round.

May God bless you, watch over you, protect you, and guide you as we come together in person to worship, have fellowship and receive peace from our Lord Jesus Christ.

Jr. High FFF Event





The Savior's gift

"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall nut be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior" (Isaiah 43:2-3a).

Savior. That is a word in which we in the Church have so often taken great comfort. We love to talk about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! And we should. We have much to be thankful for in the person and work of Jesus. We should shout it from the rooftop!

But, when was the last time you contemplated the word "Savior'? To say that Jesus is your Savior is also saying something about you. It shows your weakness. To say that Jesus is your Savior means that you are confessing that you can't save yourself.

This flies in the face of what we have been saying since we were three-years-old. We always want to do things ourselves. The child wants to be independent. The youth can't wait to leave home and be independent. The senior citizen does whatever can be done to be as independent from God's rules. The sinful steward often wants to get by with giving as little credit and stewardship as possible to the Lord! But all of these strivings for independence usually end badly! What a mess we can make of our lives at times. We are overwhelmed, consumed and drowned.

But Jesus IS our Savior. All those times we have tried to be independent of Him, He has been right there to catch us when we have fallen. When we have hoarded, He has been generous with His grace. When we have claimed ownership of that which is His and deserved death in the process, He has been there to save us and give us life! He is our Savior! Of that we can be thankful every day!

We are called then to be stewards of this Savior. We serve and live for Him every day. Our lives, and all our possessions, belong to Him. They are to be used for His glory every day! We are saved in Him. In Him we have life!

Prayer

Lord of promise, You are there for us to save us from ourselves every day. Save us again this day from ungratefulness, selfishness and unfaithful stewardship of all we are and all we have. Save us so that we in turn can be used by You to save others. Amen.

Pastor Wilson opened with a short devotion and prayer.

Secretary's Reports

The minutes of the October 24 voters meeting were reviewed.

Treasurer's Report

Mary Whitehead will be lining up an audit committee to go over the church financials at the beginning of next year, so the report is ready for the January voters meeting.

Pastor's Report

There have been a number of funerals in recent weeks and providing the counsel that goes with the grief process. Pastor and Vicar have been performing the janitorial duties at the church for the past 6 weeks.

Vicar's Report

Vicar will be starting his next semester of classes soon.

Board of Elders – Dennis Larson

The Elders have not met recently. The hiring of a Director of Christian Education was discussed, and the Elders have been given permission from the congregation to start exploring this project.

Board of Education – Vicar Hagen

Stephanie Kneeland has put together the Sunday School Christmas program. The budget overages were questioned.

Technology Committee - Sheri Markquart

The new sound boards, microphones and music stands will be here on November 19. We are waiting for additional equipment to come before everything is completed.

<u>Communication Committee - Sheri Markquart</u>

It has been found that the church is missing email addresses and other contact information for many of our church members. We discussed how to obtain the contact information we need and also to find out what is the preferred method of communication with our members. Some prefer texts over emails, and some prefer paper. We may need to call these individuals to find their preference.

Youth Committee - Sheri Markquart

We have 38 youth and 7 chaperones committed to attending the National Youth Gathering in Houston in July of 2022. After trimming the proposed budget, the group is estimating the cost to be around \$65,000. So far, the youth have raised around \$41,000. The committee is planning to do the following fundraisers in order to fill out their budget needs:

Board of Stewardship - Marlene Stueven

Reminder about the Mission Festival/Harvest Dinner on November 21. Disappointed in the poor response (29) to the Time and Talents Survey. Had a request to put a category for Youth and other items in the giving portal on the website.

Open Discussion

All boards are encouraged to start working on their budgets for 2022. The next Planning Council meeting will be held on December 7, 2021.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn at 7:25 pm. Motion carried. Pastor closed with prayer.
