# A Better Way

Shared from the LCMS stewardship Ministry by John Berg

Our Savior calls us to follow Him in generosity. "For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you" (John 13:15). We cannot give our lives for the salvation of the world, of course. Praise God, that job's already done! But with hearts full of thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us, we can follow His example of generous giving. And Jesus' generosity is not merely an example. Our Lord also commands us to act according to our gifts: "The one who contributes, [let him give] in generosity" (Rom. 12:8).

So, when we bring offerings to the Lord, we should strive to heed His command and follow the pattern He has established for us. Jesus did not give us leftovers. He gave His best. We should not give leftovers, either, but the first and best of what He has given us. Jesus did not give as an afterthought — He gave according to the plan of salvation God established from the foundation of the world. So, when it comes to our own offerings, we should make a thoughtful plan to give generously, in proportion to the way He has blessed us. Like the Macedonian Christians, who gave according to their ability, and even beyond their ability (2 Cor. 8:3), we should honor the Lord by giving a generous portion of the income that God provides us.

We should also give freely, just as Jesus gave freely for us. There is no compulsion involved in our works of love and our offerings to the Lord. We do not give grudgingly, but willingly and cheerfully, each "as he has decided in his

heart ",as the Lord says (2 Cor. 9:7). There is no New Testament ceremonial law involved here. Rather, we are free to give as generously as our Savior has given for us!

In the same way, our Lord teaches us to give generously out of our love for Him and for our neighbor. Jesus shows us that genuine love is always love "in deed" (1 John 3:18). It is love that sees our neighbor in need and gives generously to help him. It is love that hears the Word of the Lord and does what it says. If we truly love, we give generously. If we give without love, our giving is not truly following Jesus.

Finally, we follow Jesus in generosity when we support His Gospel ministry and other works of mercy. The people of Israel gave generously to construct and support the operation of the tabernacle, for that was the place where the Lord received the Old Testament sacrifices, through which He bestowed the forgiveness of sins on His people. So, they gave abundantly, so abundantly they had to be told to stop giving! (Ex. 36:5–6). In the same way, we should bring generous offerings to support the Lord's work. We support our congregations in the preaching of His Word, Baptism and the Lord's Supper, which bestow His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation, and we take care of those who are poor and needy.

Our Savior calls us to follow His example in generous giving. Let us then, with thankful hearts, rededicate ourselves to following Him in generosity.

CALL TO ORDER: by V. Pres. Warren Bey at 6:40pm.

**PRESENT:** Pastor Baumgarn, Warren Bey, Carolyn Bey, Mark Wrolstad, John and Karen Gardner, Terry Ours, Kay Conzemius, John Berg, Kyle Janzen, Martha Keeffe.

**ABSENT/EXCUSED:** Shawn Mahoney, Jana Underkofler, Sue Mravik, Kevin Keeffe, Linda Trautmann.

OPENING DEVOTION: Pastor Baumgarn read Genesis 16 v 13---(Hagar) gave this name to the Lord who spoke to her: "You are the God who sees me," for she said, "I have now seen the One who sees me." God revealed himself to her as a caring God who saw her and spoke to her and is with her. It gave her the courage to return to her mistress and do as she said. With God we can overcome all troubles and be triumphant. Pastor prayed that we all can discern what is good and right for the building of God's Kingdom.

# **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM MARCH MEETING:** The minutes were approved as written.

# TREASURERS REPORT: Year to date-3/31/23Total:

Ministry Support received=\$129,220. Total Ministry Expense=\$119,921. Total Ministry Support Received/Budget=101%. Total Ministry Expense/Budget=78%. Current Mortgage Balance=\$346,771. Congregational Notes Payable=\$150,000. Total Congregational Long Term Debt=\$496,771. First Quarter Cumulative Cash as of March 31st of this year =\$1,452.00 over budget. In Mark Wrolstad's budget comments, he presented a chart of first quarter income and expenses over the last four years. He noted that the current year's expenses are up significantly due to inflation while offerings are stable over the same time period.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

PASTOR CALL UPDATE: John G. reported his educated guess as to how much salary and benefits a full time associate Pastor with family needs to be paid per year, and expressed concern as to SOTH's ability to support the estimated amount in this uncertain economic time. With the threat of a recession this year possibly impacting our members, and expenses rising both at church and for each of our members, John does not want to chance our calling someone only to be unable to continue to pay his salary. John recom-

mended placing our call to an associate pastor on hold for a year, and see where we are then financially. A discussion of the pro's and con's of John's recommendation followed and it was agreed to support a postponement of the call for a year and reassess our financial status next year. Meanwhile Pastor Kolander will be asked to provide extra help.

**BY-LAWS UPDATE:** John Berg reported that they are finished with the Constitution and are partway through the By-laws.

**FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMITTEE:** John G. reported it should take 6 to 9 months to complete this review.

#### **MINISTRY REPORTS:**

**ELDERS:** Report attached, plus Terry reported that this year's Confirmation Banquet will be held on Saturday May 20th with no worship service that night. Confirmation Sunday will be May 21st with only a 9am service that day.

**MUSIC:** Kay C. reported that Kay L. has been practicing and plans to play at the 5th Sunday 9am- only service. she plans to be back starting in May. Dean Whiteway, the organist for the last several Sundays, likes our liturgy and would be happy to return any time we need his help. He did notice a possible problem with the organ which should be checked out.

**TRUSTEES:** report attached. Kyle also brought up a request from a Bible Study Group, the Charis Group, that Karen G. is a member of, to use our facilities for the study for the next 6 weeks. They are studying "The Chosen" and they do not have the ability to play the film where they are now meeting. After a short discussion, permission was given for Karen's group to use our facilities.

**EDUCATION:** report attached. Plus, Karen mentioned that VBS will be held from 5-7:30pm on August 8,9,10 with a meal served at 6pm. Parents will be encouraged to attend with their children. Summer Sunday school begins June 4th.
