What Do You Want?

Shared from the LCMS stewardship Ministry by John Berg

One of the best-known and most-beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters).

We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word. Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: The Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.

CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS FOR MAY 16, 2023

TREASURE'S REPORT: We are above water again and holding our own. We do expect the cash deficit to return over the summer as usual. Year to Date—as of 04/30/2023—Total Ministry received = \$174,206. Total Ministry Expense = \$158,811. Total Ministry Support Received/Budget = 103%. Total Ministry Expense/ Budget = 77%. Current Mortgage Balance = \$344,283. Congregational Notes Payable = \$150,000. Total Congregational Long-Term Debt = \$494,283. \$2,953 extra was paid on the mortgage.

PASTOR CALL UPDATE: John Gardner reported that when Pastor Willie was told of our decision to put the Call on hold for financial reasons, Pastor Willie said a number of other churches are having the same problems, and when we feel we are ready to go forward with the call, he is ready to work with us.

BY-LAWS UPDATE: John Berg is handing out to each of the boards, descriptions of their responsibilities, and if there are any changes they would like to see, get it back to John listing the requested changes. John would like the reports back by the June Council Meeting on June 20th.

FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMITTEE: With Sue not available, there is no report. John G. thought the next meeting would be June 16th.

ELDERS: Reuben Mravik has agreed to be an Elder. He will join on Zoom since he works out of town. Several people have volunteered to be ushers but more are still needed.

MUSIC: Kay L. is 2/3rds back to playing the organ. She is still unable to use her left arm. We need a new organ repair person since they have had no reply from the one they usually use. Rob is making plans to do a Gospel Worship Service soon.

TRUSTEES: The Church's insurance policy (umbrella coverage) will be changing and Kyle is waiting for quotes. Thanks go to Jim and Marilyn Magnuson for all the work they have done, as they step down from the Board of Trustees.

PRESCHOOL: Linda reported that the open gym was well received. One of their 4 year old preschoolers received an award for saving her Mom when Mom passed out after having dialed 911. The child talked to the operator and did everything the operator told her to do to help her mom, including rolling her mom over and unlocking the door for the paramedics. The last day of pre

school is May 18th, but they have already had celebrations, and Linda received so many good reports from families, plus she saw generations of former preschoolers bringing their children to SOTH preschool. The Mathew Fletcher Scholarship has been helping many preschool families with tuition. Both summer school programs are full with 20 children each. The Preschool Teachers would like to attend The Concordia Teacher's Summit in Mequon.

STEWARDSHIP: John Berg reported that contributions for our spring mission, the New Life Resource Center, were received throughout the month of April, in the final amount of \$3,660. This was sent to New Life with a note of support for the God-pleasing work they accomplish. The fall mission emphasis will be to support our Christion brothers and sisters in Ukraine. Pastor Harrison would like us to consider giving to the National Offering designated fund of LCMS. This is to pay for mission materials to be printed in other languages. It will be announced so that anyone interested in giving to this designated fund can do so.

The **LWML** will be sponsoring an ingathering for needed supplies for our veterans sometime this summer.

VOTER'S ASSEMBLY was informed that we needed to place associate pastor call on hold for one year and hire Pastor Kolander. Our contract with Pastor Kolander was already signed for \$1,000 per month for one year. They set a certain number of hours including preaching and visiting the homes of new people visiting our church. This should be reaffirmed by the Voter's.

CHIME AREA LIGHTING: Kyle is waiting for a quote. One generous member donated money for a portion of the cost. The trustees will be able to pay the amount left from their budget.

GOOD OF THE GROUP: People should get back to wearing their nametags. They are very helpful for new people visiting and for new members.

THE CANCER SUPPORT GROUP will be meeting on June 27th at 6pm. Kay is working on the Confirmation Banquet and feels that we need to come up with a different way to honor our Confirmands. This year's guest list is up to 50.

HAVE A QUESTION? WE HAVE AN ANSWER

<u>Q & A</u> Are all sins equal in God's eyes?

A boy gets an air rifle for Christmas and wraps himself up in his winter coat to brave the Wisconsin winter to enjoy target practice in his backyard. Mom hears a crash and a plink in the living room. The son had shot a bb sized hole in the big picture window! The mom was furious and yelled at her son, "Not even an hour of owning that air rifle, and you broke my window!"

The son replied, "Mom, the window's five feet by five feet! I broke less than a tenth of a percent of the window!" I forgot to mention, the boy was good at math. However, that didn't help his case. The air rifle disappeared, and he was grounded for the rest of Christmas vacation.

"Are all sins equal in God's eyes?" I would relate that question to our picture window from our Christmas story. How much of the window needs to be damaged for it to be "broken"? We would say any amount, even a bb sized hole would break the window. James 2:10 is clear: "For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it." In this sense, all sins are indeed equal in God's eyes. Even the slightest lie or one lustful look "breaks the window," breaking the relationship with a perfect, holy God, and sends us to eternal damnation.

What is Mom going to do on Christmas day? No window repair crew is going to go out on a holiday. Maybe she just patches over the hole with some packing tape. The situation might be more dire if the son shot an arrow through the window, or a shotgun, or rammed a toboggan through the window. There could be cuts from shattered glass, and even setting personal injury aside, it's much harder to heat a home when a 5 feet by 5 feet window suddenly becomes open to December weather.

All sins may be equal in God's eyes in that they separate us from Him, but they are not all equal in the ways in which they harm our neighbor and harden our soul to the deceitfulness of sin. Looking at a woman with lustful intent on the beach and having an affair may both be violations of the sixth commandment, "do not commit adultery," but clearly one has more damaging repercussions. Zoning out during a worship service and skipping worship for a decade may both be violations of the third commandment, "Remember the Sabbath day," but the latter runs a higher risk of one losing his or her faith.

The mother didn't get out a caliper to measure the size of the bb hole, she took out the yellow book and lined up phone numbers of window contractors to call on December 26th. Our job as Christians is not to measure the size of our sins, but to turn from them, and trust that in Jesus all our sins have been forgiven: big or small.
