DEFINE YOUR LIFE BY HOW YOU LIVE

Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away.

Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us citizens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and making a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relationships with friends and family, with neighbors and coworkers, and with the Lord. It shifts our focus from asking the question, "How can I be a friend, family member, neighbor and servant to others," to asking the question, "What have they done for me lately?" We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and become more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). page 3

CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS FOR JULY 18, 2023

TREASURERS AND FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Year-to-Date: Total Ministry Support Received---\$224,472. Total Ministry Expense---\$240,005. Total Ministry Support Received/Budget---90%. Total Ministry Expense/Budget---79%. Mortgage Principle Paid=\$18,244. Budgeted=\$15,431. Extra Debt Paid=\$2,813.

DISCUSSION REGARDING ONE VS. TWO SERVICES

The decision was made to call a Voter's meeting in August to have the voters decide which way to go regarding 1 or 2 services for Sunday Morning church worship beginning in September. This vote will be abiding by our Constitution. There will also be two other topics on the agenda for the upcoming voters meeting.

BY-LAWS UPDATE

John Berg reported that the committee is continuing to work on this and they are now talking to some of the Boards to get their input. There are many topics to sort out and they want to do the very best they can on the final product. John is hopeful this will be done by the end of August. It will not be ready for the upcoming voters meeting.

GENESIS PROJECT UPDATE

Their first task is to create a brochure with information regarding the collection of a Community Survey. The Community Survey process will be kicked off at SOTH on July 30th during the picnic after Bible study. Members of each congregation are also asked to complete their own survey either on line or on forms available at the office.

Kay Conzemius reported that a group (not choir) will be singing for the services on the last Sunday of the months of July and August.

STAINED GLASS WINDOW UPDATE

This project is currently being worked on, and the generous donor is much appreciated.

VBS NEWS

The education committee are currently recruiting people to help with various areas of the programs and activities. There has been lots of advertising in the community, and the meals to be served are planned and will be purchased.

PRESCHOOL

The floors are done. They are giving the surveys to former families that go back for several years who could better answer the questions.

they are hoping to start several new support groups in our church. One would support relatives of young people who are transitioning or have transitioned (transgender), and help the family to deal with this change. They are also looking at starting a grief support group at SOTH.

WHAT CAN WE LEARN FROM A SKEPTIC?

From the July discussion of "A Case for Miracles" by Lee Strobel



The Ladies Monday Night Bible group continued with chapters 1 and 2 in the book "The Case for Miracles" by Lee Strobel. In these chapters, a selfdescribed skeptic is interviewed about his journey from non-believer to believer to skeptic. Doubt crept in as he lost touch with his fellow believers

and pursued other interests. Science became his approach to miraculous claims; requiring copious amounts of documented, measurable, scientific evidence. He described a time when he prayed for a miraculous healing for his friend, but God did not answer his prayer in the way he wanted. After this experience, his faith disappeared. His logic: there was no miracle—there is no God—stuff just randomly happens.

This skeptic provides arguments against miracles and the existence of God. The author will respond in subsequent chapters with compelling evidence for God's divine intervention in our lives. But first, what can we learn from this person's journey into skepticism?

There was discussion about how the skeptic's journey seemed to fit the Parable of the Sower (Mark 4:1-20) where the seed did not flourish. We must then ask ourselves if we spend time preparing our hearts to receive and believe God's word, so that our faith flourishes and sustains us. Spend time in Scripture, for it tells us: that faith is needed to please God (Hebrews 11:6), that righteousness comes from God through faith in Christ to all who believe (Romans 3:22), that God is attentive to the prayers of the righteous (1Peter 3:12), and, as fellow believers, we are to encourage one another to remain firm in Christ till the end (Hebrews 3:13-14).

We considered Scripture's story of Peter's miraculous rescue from prison (Acts 12:5-17). The church prayed earnestly to God for Peter. What did they have? Fellowship to encourage each other and faith to pray. There was really nothing else they could do but pray and trust God to care for Peter. Were they asking for a specific outcome and proof that their prayer was answered? No. Did God hear their prayer and provide proof? Yes indeed! They were astonished to see Peter standing at their door. Praise God!

In August we study what this skeptic thinks about the miracles of creation and Jesus' resurrection, as well as how he views life after death.
