CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS FOR October 19

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mark reported that SOTH has still been experiencing a summer-like slump in giving, relative to expenses, through September and into October. There are currently more expenses, (bills and salaries), needing to be paid than there is money coming in to cover them. The financial stewardship report, year to date, 9/30/2023, is as follows--Total Ministry Support Received = \$314,816. Total Ministry Expense =\$350,638. Total Ministry Support received/ Budget = 87%. Total Ministry Expense/Budget = 77%. Mortgage Principle paid = \$\$25,816. Current Mortgage Balance = \$331,707.

ELECTRONIC SIGN UPDATE:

SOTH will not have to pay the \$500 to La Crosse Sign Company, at this time, to design an electronic sign for us to purchase at a later date. We would only be charged that amount if we do not use their company at such time that we order a sign. There is currently \$2,050 in the designated sign account.

BUDGETS:

Mark would like all of the ministries to get their projected 2024 budgets in as soon as possible so the council can discuss them at the November meeting.

WORSHIP SERVICES:

All of our services are strictly Bible Based. The style and music for our services is still being worked on by Pastor and Kay Conzemius.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS UPDATE:

John Berg went through the changes the committee is recommending for the new Constitution and Bylaws and addressed questions that came up. It is close to being voted on by the council, then there will be a voter's information meeting where it will be presented and questions can be asked and answered. Then there will be a Voter's Meeting to approve or reject the changes proposed, and if approved, it will be forwarded to the South Wisconsin District for their approval.

GIVING TREE:

There will soon be a giving tree in the Narthex where we can take several "ornaments" that will have a Christmas gift request on each one, some for people in need, and some for Pet Smart gift cards to support La Crosse's Canine Unit. Gifts and gift cards need to be returned to the church at a date yet to be determined.



<u>RECAP ON "CALLED by the HOLY SPIRIT"</u> - Ladies Monday Night Bible Study (LMNBS) Called by the Holy Spirit—Submitted by Mindy Braun

Miracles today and those recorded in the Bible...What do they have in common?

The LMNBS discussed Chapter 6 in "The Case for Miracles" by Lee Strobel. Here, we read about Craig Keener's investigation into contemporary miracle claims.

We opened with an article entitled "The Miracles of Jesus" by Pastor Bryan Wolfmueller (posted 1/24/11). In Matt 8:1-4, a leper said "Lord if You are willing, You can make me clean". Jesus replied "I am willing". In Matt 8:5-13, a centurion asked Jesus to heal his servant, who was at home. "Jesus said to him, I will go and heal him. The centurion replied,

Lord, I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed...When Jesus heard this, He was astonished... (at the centurion's) great faith...Then Jesus said...It will be done just as you believed it would."

These miracles demonstrate coming before Jesus with faith, humility and trust. Jesus is powerful and willing. We marvel at miracles. Jesus marvels at, and commends our faith. We can trust Jesus to use His power compassionately to serve us and love us. The article ends by stating that the greatest miracle of all is when Jesus speaks "I forgive you, and a miracle occurs: we are forgiven."

Why are the miracles of Jesus recorded in the Bible? John 20:31 tells us: "But these things are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name."

Next, we delved into the 18 contemporary miracle case studies that Keener investigated; bodies mended, illness eliminated, physical abilities restored, and people resuscitated. Faith, humility and trust were present. The timing of prayer and healing was dramatic. Jesus was revealed to the healed individual and also to all who witnessed the miracle. People came to faith. Jesus compassionately uses His power today, just as in Biblical times, and continues to make His salvation known to us.


