Monday Night Ladies Bible Study November Recap

ARE ALL MIRACLES FROM GOD? - shared by Mindy Braun, Ladies Monday Night Bible Study leader

The Ladies Monday Night Bible study discussed The Science of Miracles, from "The Case for Miracles" by Lee Strobel. We looked at miracles not just through science, but also through the Bible directing us to "test the spirits". God's miracles point us to His saving grace through Jesus. Are there others who do miracles, and why?

Jesus has a warning for us in Matt 24:24. "For false Christs and false prophets will appear and perform great signs and miracles to deceive even the elect..." Deception causes one to believe something that is not true in order for the deceiver to gain some personal advantage. 1John 4:1 tells us "...do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God..." How do we do this? 1John 2:22-23 explains, "Who is the liar? It is the man who denies that Jesus is the Christ. Such a man is the antichrist — he denies the Father and the Son. No one who denies the Son has the Father..."

Consider Simon the Sorcerer in Acts 8:9-11. "..He boasted that he was someone great, and all the people...exclaimed, this man is the divine power known as the Great Power. They followed him because he had amazed them with his magic." Simon's motive in doing miracles was to deceive others and gain self-importance, not to point to Jesus.

Lastly, we "tested the spirits" as we looked at scientific studies that focused on whether patient recovery benefitted from intercessory prayer. One deceptive study recruited non-Christians to pray for the patients, and then concluded that prayer did not make a difference. Another study recruited Christians active in their faith to pray for the patients, and affirmed that these patients had better outcomes. "Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine...to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus...for ever and ever! Amen." Eph. 3:20-21.

CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS FOR NOVEMBER 16

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP REPORT:

Year to Date: as of 10/31/2023

Total Ministry Support Received=\$355,798

Total Ministry Expense=\$389,259 Mortgage Principle Paid=\$28,358

Current Mortgage Balance=\$329,165

Total Congregational Long-Term Debt=\$479,165 Mark Wrolstad—Treasurer, reported that we only have about 50% of the original amount of money left in the Rainy-Day Fund to use toward making up the difference between income and expenses. This Council Meeting was devoted to cutting the new budget as much as possible. December's meeting will concentrate on the income side, such as what can we do to bring in more income to meet all of our bills.

BUDGET INFORMATIONAL MEETING:

This is scheduled for January 14th, 2024 right after the second service. The New Budget will be presented to the Congregation and a discussion, and question and answer time will be provided. There will not be any voting at this meeting. All who wish to be informed are encouraged to attend.

This is scheduled for January 21st, 2024, right after the second service. All matters ready to be voted upon will be taken care of at this meeting.


Monthly Update
