Thoughts from Pastor Stites:

Which is MORE Important: CROSS or EMPTY TOMB?

As we approach the holy week celebration, we divide up the great event of our salvation over several days, rejoicing in all the steps Christ took to win our salvation. But this raises an important question, which is more important to our salvation, is it Christ's death upon the cross, or His resurrection on Sunday morning? Which really is the highest of high holy days: Good Friday or Easter?

We do believe, teach, and confess that Christ was victorious on the cross, that our salvation was completely won when Christ died for us. As Christ Himself said before He took His final breath, "It is finished." (John 19:30) There was nothing left to do, Jesus had defeated sin, death and the devil, He won forgiveness, life and salvation for all mankind. **IT IS FINISHED!**

BUT, we also confess that the resurrection is where we SEE the victory, that is where we see that Christ has been victorious, most notably over death, as He rose to never die again. As St. Paul argued in 1 Corinthians 15:17-19, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied." This is because Christ said He would rise from the dead, as in Mark 9:31, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And when he is killed, after three days **HE WILL RISE**." If Jesus did not rise from the dead as He said He would, we cannot trust anything He said, let alone about His death. Therefore, our entire faith is MEANINGLESS if Christ did not rise from the dead!

So which is the highest of high holy days? Is it Good Friday, the day Christ our Lord suffered and died to win the victory? Or is it Easter, the day we see Christ our Lord has destroyed the power of death and risen victorious?

The great Lutheran answer is ... YES! You cannot divide these days. As I said, if Christ did not rise from the dead, everything else does not matter, Jesus' death would be meaningless, and our entire faith would be worthless. But also, how could Jesus rise from the dead, if He did not die in the first place? The resurrection can only happen if there is death.

In reality we see them as two sides of the same coin, the ONE story of our salvation, as we see Christ BOTH die and rise for us! They are one celebration, we just play the part of the faithful on Good Friday, seeing our Lord and Savior die for us and outwardly we mourn, while in our hearts we are screaming, "It is not over yet!"

Join us as we celebrate the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ Good Friday and Easter, and every time we gather. Amen!



President Weeks called the meeting to order at 9:56 a.m.

Pastor Stites opened with prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Minutes from the February 21, 2023, meeting were reviewed. Dick Koppe moved to accept the Minutes. Shannon Cady seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Treasurer's report for February 2023 was presented. Sharie stated that there were no significant items to review. Discussion followed on moving Memorial Funds to the Organ Fund.

Council members will contact Memorial Fund family members regarding this transfer. Dick Koppe moved to accept the Treasurer's Report for February 2023. Pete Dryer seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor reported that the switching of pulpits for Lenten services seems to be going well. The 11:00 a.m. video sermon is not ideal but still attendance at the 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. runs about equal. With winter visitors starting to leave, Pastor suggested that one service be held on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Times for the services were discussed. Pete Dryer made a motion to hold the service at 6:00 p.m. on both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Brad Erickson seconded motion. Motion carried. Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday services will be at 9:30 a.m. as normal. Pastor next

Motion carried. Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday services will be at 9:30 a.m. as normal. Pastor next addressed the upcoming Synodical Convention. Pastor and Theresa are registered. They are alternates and will only attend if the pastoral or lay delegate cannot attend.

<u>President's Report:</u> President Jon reminded Council members that the Voters' meeting will be held on March 26 after Church service.

Vice President's Report: No report.

<u>Elders Report:</u> Dick Koppe reported that the Elders are still making quite a few calls to members. At least 40 had been made this month. Winter visitors starting to leave.

Trustees Report: Pete Dryer reviewed maintenance items taken care of since the February meeting. A copy of Pete's report is on file. Pete reported that he met with Sign Masters on site and looked at locations for the new sign. Pete shared various designs for the sign including digital and nondigital. The most expensive sign costs \$38,000. Our new sign would probably cost between \$12,000-\$15,000. Since this will need Voter approval, a display board with the different signs will be put up at the back of the church. This will allow members to see their choices prior to voting. In discussing funding options for the sign, the household items donated by the Kaisers are in storage and a yard sale could be held in the Fall with the proceeds going toward the new sign purchase. Also, Memorial Fund families should be given a choice of moving funds to either the Organ Fund or the New Sign fund. Another option that would require Voter approval is to transfer sign costs from the New Building Fund that has a balance of \$74,519. Sign Masters requires a 50% down payment for the sign.

<u>Evangelism Report:</u> Barb Koppe reported that next Sunday is the last to collect sheets for Right Turn for Vets. In April we will be collecting bath towels, wash clothes and kitchen towels for Right Turn for Vets. They can be new or gently used.

Stewardship Report: No report.

Administrative: Kelly shared information from Christ Lutheran on their Easter Eggstravaganza. Information on the event will be posted on the bulletin board. As of right now with no one to head up an Easter brunch at SOTH, no formal breakfast will be held. Attendance cards are running low and Yuma Printing who has produced the cards in the past is no longer in business. Costs of the cards was discussed. Kelly presented a new card she designed that can be printed in house. Pete Dryer will also get

estimates from another source.

Old Business: None

New Business: The next Council meeting will be held on May 16, 2023. There will be no April meeting.

Sharie Jasper moved to adjourn. Shannon Cady seconded. Motion passed.
