Thoughts from Pastor Stites:

This I know, that God is for me!

Psalm 56 is a wonderful prayer and statement of faith. It begins with a cry for mercy because enemies oppress us. Now, this could be seen as an enemy in war, a conquering and oppressive foreign nation, individual enemies that continually sin against us, which are all part of the suffering in this fallen world, we could also see it as those who war against God and His Church. But if you take a step back, even when you do not have a visible enemy, but as you endure dark and difficult times like unemployment, loneliness, depression, etc., we cry out to God for help!

This is where the psalm changes tone, "When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can flesh do to me?" (Ps 56:3–4) In the midst of difficult times, in the face of an enemy, we are to put our trust in God! It is first and foremost a reminder to us; we who easily forget the power and love of God in the midst of darkness, we NEED to be reminded that we can, and that we should be always trusting in God.

But even more, it is a battle cry, it is our song of defiance against the evil around us. In the face of great difficulty or dark times, when we face an enemy who wants to sin against us, when the devil himself wants to fill us with fear and despair, we cry out, "In God I trust, I shall not be afraid!"

The reason we can say this is because of the key line in verse 9, "This I know, that God is for me." That is why we cry out to God, that is why we can be defiant against the sin and darkness of the world around us, God is on our side. This is made even more glorious because we admit that we too are sinful, that we do not deserve God to be on our side. But He chose to love us, to love us more than we could ever hate Him. And so, He came in our flesh, in order to live, die and rise again to save us from our own sin as well as the sin of the world, from the death we deserve and the death others would impose, to save us from the great enemy of the devil. God is for us because He has already saved us!

As Paul said in Romans 8:31-39, "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? ... Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ... For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

The next time you are facing difficult times, learn to pray Psalm 56. And do not be afraid, rather boldly say, "This I know, that God is for me!"




Easy Evangelism:

Giving Millions for the Lord's Work

Many years ago, a young man of sixteen years left home to seek his fortune. All his worldly possessions were tied up in a bundle, which he carried in his hand. As he trudged along, he met an old neighbor, the captain of a canal-boat, and the following conversation took place, which changed the boy's life.

"Well, William, where are your going?"

"I don't know," he answered. "Father is too poor to keep me at home any longer and says I must now make a living for myself."

"There's no trouble about that," said the captain. "Be sure you start right, and you'll do well."

William told his friend that the only trade he knew anything about was soap and candle making, at which he had helped his father while at home.

"Well," said the old man, "let me pray with you once more and give you a little advice, and then I will let you go."

They both kneeled down, and the dear old man prayed earnestly for William and then gave this advice: "Someone will soon be the leading soap-maker in New York. It can be you as well as anyone. I hope it may. Be a good man; give your heart to Christ; pay the Lord all that belongs to Him of every dollar you earn; make an honest soap; give a full pound, and I am certain you yet will be a prosperous and rich man."



When the boy arrived in the city, he found it hard to get work. Lonesome and far from home, he remembered his mother's words and the last words of the canal-boat captain. He was then led to "seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness" (Matthew 6:33). He remembered his promise to the old captain that the first dollar he earned brought up the question of the Lord's part. In the Bible, he found that God commanded His people to give one-tenth; so, he said,

"If the Lord will take one-tenth, I will give that." And so, he did; and ten cents of every dollar were sacred to the Lord.

He found regular employment and soon became a partner; after a few years his partners died, and William became the sole owner of the business.

He now resolved to keep his promise to the old captain; he made an honest soap, gave a full pound, and instructed his bookkeeper to open an account with the Lord, and carry one-tenth of all his income to that account. He prospered; his business grew; his family was blessed; his soap sold, and he grew rich faster than he had ever hoped. He then gave two-tenths, and prospered more than ever. Then he gave three-tenths, then four-tenths, then five-tenths.

He educated his family, settled all his plans for life, and gave all his income to the Lord's work. He prospered more than ever.

This is the story of Mr. William Colgate, who has given millions of dollars to the Lord's cause and left a name that will never die.

President Weeks called the meeting to order at 9:53 a.m.

Pastor Stites opened with prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Minutes from the April 25, 2023, special meeting were reviewed. Sharie Jasper moved to accept the Minutes. Shannon Cady seconded. Motion carried. Minutes from the May 16, 2023, meeting were reviewed. Dick Koppe moved to accept the Minutes. Pete Dryer seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Treasurer's report for May 2023 was presented. After review, Pete Dryer moved to accept the Treasurer's Report for May 2023. Shannon Cady seconded. Motion carried.
