Thoughts from Pastor Stites:

Back to School!

It's that time of year (though nowadays it's in August) when children begin a new year at school; new classes, teachers, and friends. There is a joy and excitement with the beginning of a new year, but also a bit of dread at the mountain of homework that will soon come across the desk. ... At least there would be, if you were still in school. The vast majority of our congregation has been out of school for a long time, and we only live vicariously through sending our children and grandchildren to endure the hardships we had to endure long ago.



Our Fall Celebration will be held at Holtville on October 21st. There will be the election of officers at that time. If you feel the calling to serve, let Sharie Jasper know.



"Do everything without complaining and arguing, so that no one can criticize you." –Philippians 2:14-15

Remember, His Word is His power (Romans 1:16). Going beyond that by arguing and debating is a distraction and a time waster, and it should be avoided. So, don't debate! Just share the truth in love.

He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things He planned for us long ago.

Ephesians 210

Inadequate as we are, God uses us as His hands, feet, and mouth. "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10). We are His stewards. As redeemed people of God, we are called and equipped to render willingly the firstfruits of our lives and resources to Him.

August 15, 2023

<u>Attendees:</u> Jon Weeks, Pastor Stites, Dick Koppe, Pete Dryer, Kelly Hinrichs, Sue Cairns, Kathy Richardson, Barbara Koppe

President Weeks called the meeting to order at 9:52 a.m.

Pastor Stites opened with prayer. Sue Cairns was then inducted to the Council as Stewardship Chair. <u>Secretary's Report:</u> Minutes from the July 18, 2023 meeting were reviewed. Sue Cairns moved to accept the Minutes. Dick Koppe seconded. Motion carried. Minutes from the Special Council Meeting of July 23, 2023 were reviewed. Dick Koppe moved to accept the Minutes. Barbara Koppe seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Treasurer's report for July 2023 was presented. Kelly Hinrichs noted that \$37.37 has been received via Kroger Rewards in a five-month period. Jon reported that the Summary of Congregational Receipts for District has been received for the period ended June 30, 2023, copy attached. After review, Kathy Richardson moved to accept the Treasurer's Report for July 2023. Pete Dryer seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor shared information from the 68th LCMS Synodical Convention, copy attached. The Pastors' conference will be held September 24-27, 2024, in Palm Springs.

<u>President's Report:</u> A question had come up from the attorney for the Morner Trust. They said that Shepherd of the Hills Church property was still under Calvary Lutheran Church. Pete and Kelly will look into this (subsequent to the Council Meeting, Kelly checked on the title of Shepherd of the Hills, and it had been transferred from Calvary to Shepherd.) Jon also mentioned building maintenance for the Church, i.e., fascia replacement, painting exterior and sealing doors were examples of items that need to be taken care of. A list of items and estimates will be garnered and then a total cost will be presented to the Voters Meeting for overall approval. Repairs won't start until the Church has funds for them which will probably be next Spring/Summer.

Vice President's Report: No report.

<u>Elders Report:</u> Dick Koppe reported that 32+ calls were made to members during the month. Pastor's vacation time in October was discussed and also fill-in possibilities. Dick also commented that a member was lost because we don't have a Saturday service.

<u>Trustees Report:</u> Pete Dryer reviewed work done around the church and for the Morner Trust, copies of report and the Affidavit of Receipt and Release on the Morner property are attached. Now that the Morner property on 25th Place has been released to the Church, the Council discussed holding an open house for members to purchase house items prior to turning the furniture, etc. to an auction company. The open house will be held sometime between August 28 - September 1. A notice will be in the Sunday bulletin when the dates and times are set. Discussion was held on moving the Church sign closer to the parking lot entrance.

Evangelism Report: No report.

Stewardship Report: No report.

Administrative: Kelly reported that the October Council meeting will be held on October 24 due to Pastor's vacation. Upcoming Council elections to be held at the Voters Meeting in December was discussed. The Nomination Committee is to be comprised of the Council Vice President, Council member, Congregation member. Up for reelection/election are the positions of President, Vice President, Trustee, Stewardship. Kelly will be on vacation October 4-10. She will put in extra hours to get work completed before and after vacation. Kelly stated that she has not yet started working on a Facebook page for the church.
