
Bible Study

Please let Peggy Chestnut know if you would like to participate.



September 25th Voter's Meeting Recap

It was reported that gifts and other income are slightly above budget while expenses are below budget.

New Endowment Fund Board Members: Cynthia Weimer and Josh Ninke

Child Development Center (CDC)

- Property was purchased for \$850,000. The original total cost for the project was estimated at \$1,500,000. Current projections are closer to \$2,000,000-2,500,000.
- Full capacity is not expected until the third year of operation.
- St. Paul was asked to pay a "minimum" monthly amount to use the facility. It was suggested by Pastor to pay \$110/mo.
- The architect plans on sufficient cabinets in classrooms & other storage that can be dedicated to STP use.
- The church currently using the facility will be out of the building by the end of November.
- The date to begin construction has not been set. It may be later this year or in the spring.
- The CDC will pay for construction of a road to connect to St. Paul's parking lot. St. Paul has been asked to fund construction of a joint sign on Atlanta Highway as well as cleanup the tree line between the two properties.

Update Existing Church Facilities

- There is an initiative to "freshen up" facilities and a list of possible items is being developed. A group will be formed to evaluate and prioritize the items.
- A phased approach will be likely. No schedule is yet established.
- The same architect doing the CDC will be giving a proposal for work related to making the entry from the parking lot appealing (e.g., changing doors, converting library into Joyce office/welcome station, making hallway from parking lot thru building to sanctuary "straight thru", better signage, landscaping, etc.)
- There are possible cost savings if we can "piggyback" on the contractors doing the CDC work.
