At our last meeting we began a discussion about knowing how and when to introduce Christianity as well as bringing our relationship with Jesus into a conversation with our Buddhist neighbors and acquaintances. (Did you know that about 85.5 % of Vietnamese people are Buddhists? China has the largest population of Buddhists, app. 244 million. There are about 488 million Buddhists in the world.)
