A few weeks ago, St. Stephen received a “Thank you” letter and certificate from our synod office in appreciation for the \$22,280 we contributed to synodical mission support in 2014. We had committed to support the ministries of our synod with \$22,000, but, because of your generous contributions to “Benevolence” we were able to *exceed* our commitment. Your “Benevolence” giving helps fund the important work we do together as “Church” in the Lower Susquehanna Synod, and, indeed, around the world; work that we are not able to do as an individual, isolated congregation.

Out of every \$1 you give you “Benevolence”, 87.5¢ goes towards synodical mission support and 12.5¢ supports social ministry projects at St. Stephen. For every \$1 we give to synodical mission support, 45¢ goes directly to support ministries of the ELCA such as global mission, malaria eradication, educating women, rostered leader scholarships, new and renewed missions, training leaders, and more. 55¢ of every mission support dollar stays in our synod. The following is a snapshot of how these mission support dollars were used by our synod in 2014 to feed others as we are fed by Christ:

### Equipping Leaders:

- 26 Candidates for Rostered Ministry received \$24,840 in scholarships
- Six first call candidates ordained and placed in LSS congregations
- More than 70 events and workshops
- 1,000+ resources circulated from our LSS Center for Faith Formation
- \$363,939 dollars provided to support camps, campus ministries, and seminary
- Offered first-ever rostered leaders’ wellness retreat

### Encouraging Cooperation:

- 48,870 miles traveled by staff members to congregations across our synod
- More than 350 staff visits for worship leadership/

- preaching/educational events
- Provided coaching through council retreats, training events, and individual support
- Provided support for committees, tables, and task forces
- Provided communication through web site, *Carings & Sharings*, and social media

### Engaging in New Mission:

- 1 new synodically authorized worshipping community (Peter’s Porch)
- 1 mission probe (Communities of Hope)
- 4 congregational covenants for renewal and/ or redevelopment
- Coached/equipped 15 mission redevelopers
- Provided 850+ staff hours for coaching and renewal training
- 17 successful call processes completed, each one representing an average investment of \$4,500 in staff & support

THANK YOU for helping make this work possible as we “do better together” in our Lower Susquehanna Synod and ELCA work that we cannot do alone. At our 2014 Congregational Meeting, we voted to increase our synodical mission support by almost 10%, from \$22,000 in 2014 to \$24,000 in 2015. This increase helps our synod continue to reach into our congregations, community, and world to equip leaders, encourage cooperation, engage in new ministries, and plan for the future.

To help us meet our \$24,000 commitment, I would like to ask those who already give to “Benevolence” to consider increasing your gift by 10%, and those who don’t currently give to “Benevolence” to consider an initial gift of any amount. The work of our synod and national church is exciting, Spirit-filled, and life-changing. Your gifts help make this work possible. THANK YOU for your generosity and participation in God’ work in our world.

# Leadership Ledger

## Executive Summary Report:

Council met on Monday, May 11, 2015.

The following actions were taken by Council:

Council approved a facility use request for Marty and Bonnie Baim for Fellowship Hall

Council approved the following transfers of funds per the 2014 Congregational Meeting:

\$5,000 to Mike Lengel's account at Gettysburg Seminary, from the Longsdorf Interest Fund

\$500 to the El Salvador fund from Investment Interest Fund

\$500 for ELCA Global Missions from Investment Interest Fund

Council also approved the purchase of a hand washing sink and a compartment sink with faucet for the kitchen. The purchase is being funded through Romayne Yohn's, Clem Clement's and Genevieve Yohn's Memorials.

Additionally, Council

... was delighted to receive a proposal from Noah Wills to submit a legislative resolution in recognition of St. Stephen's 250th Anniversary in 2017. Noah will be organizing teams to update our recorded history and contacting our legislators.

Council thanked the Property Committee for their installation of the stoves and continued work on the kitchen.


Council continued plans to celebrate Pastor John's 20th anniversary of ordination. There is information in your bulletin. Please take the opportunity to join in our celebration of Pastor' John's ministry.

Council also discussed yesterday's Child Protection class and the importance of as many members as possible attending. If you were unable to attend, there will be another date scheduled in the fall. Any questions, see Pastor Caitlin or Tom Burson.

Pastor Caitlin let Council know that starting on Tuesday, May 12th, we will have a volunteer from Keystone Services assisting Kevin with shredding on a bi-weekly basis.

Pastor Caitlin also solicited feedback about our experience with Vicar Avery. If you have any comments to share, please let her know.

Finally, Council discussed the Apple Festival. As you may be aware, at the congregational meeting in November, the Clellands indicated they were unable to serve as coordinators this year. While we have many volunteers that have led many of the sub-committees we are lacking the critical position for the coordinator. Carol indicated she has all the documentation and is very willing to mentor anyone who would be willing to serve in this capacity. **Without a coordinator, we will be unable to host the 45th annual apple festival. Council will be meeting to discuss the fate of the Apple Festival at our June 8th meeting.** If you are willing to serve, or co-serve with others please see any member of Council as soon as possible. It is imperative we get your inputs before our next meeting.

The Educational Ministries Committee would love your help! We need volunteers to help the week go smoothly.


Do you like to cook? We can use your help in the kitchen.

**Camp Nawakwa is bringing their Day Camp to Mechanicsburg!** Children who have completed kindergarten through fifth grade as of June are invited to a day camp sponsored by Mechanicsburg area Lutheran churches and staffed by members of the Camp Nawakwa team. Our week of camp will kick off at 4:30pm on Sunday, June 14th with a potluck dinner and celebration for campers and their families. Our regular camp will run 8:45am-4:30pm from Monday June 15th through Friday June 19th. Childcare is available before camp beginning at 8am and after camp ending at 5:15pm. Our day will be filled with singing, crafts, indoor and outdoor recreation, large group worship, and small group Bible study on the theme A Love That Never Ends. Lunch will be provided daily. Cost per camper is \$100. St. Stephen will provide a 50% scholarship for all of our children who want to attend Day Camp, with additional scholarship money available upon request. Registration forms will soon be available.


You all know the story of little Maia, whom we continue to try to see each year since her recovery from neuroblastoma discovered on her 2nd birthday.

## We believe in what?

On most Sundays, we profess our faith together with the whole catholic church using the words of the Apostle's or Nicene Creed. This profession of faith takes place after the reading of scripture and sermon, *in response* to the Word of God we have heard, and the faith God's Word kindles within us. These creeds are ancient documents of the church, written to explicitly declare what it is we believe when we say that we are Christians, and to teach those preparing for baptism about the Christian faith.

During the summer months, we are going to profess our faith using excerpts from Luther's Small Catechism. As you may know, Luther wrote the Small Catechism so that parents could teach their children about the faith in the home (Luther was disgusted when he visited churches in neighboring "Christian" cities, and discovered that no one knew the basic tenets of our faith!) The Small Catechism includes expla-

nations for each of the ten commandments, the three articles of the Apostle's Creed, and each petition of the Lord's Prayer. We will work through these in June, July, and August. The Small Catechism also includes explanations about baptism, holy communion, and confession, which we will use at a later point in time.

Those who were raised in the Lutheran church likely studied (and maybe even memorized) the Small Catechism years ago, but, perhaps it's been a long time since you opened it. It is my hope that a return to its riches during these coming months will re-ignite our faith, reveal new truths about God, and speak to our daily lives. If you have any questions, or would like your own copy of Luther's Small Catechism, please let me know.
