Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Maybe you have been inconvenienced this holiday season. Maybe you didn't get to celebrate getting to see the baby as you have in the past with everyone else. Did you feel left out? Was it by your choice or did others simply not contact you? It really doesn't make any difference which way it was. The point is, there's this hole or at least this part of us (which is now our history) which doesn't fit and has some jagged edges which hurt. The December 14th Issue of Time Magazine had a red X over 2020, labeled "The Worst Year Ever." Some people just want to forget it and yet we can't.

[Thereafter, the triennium cycle will continue forward from 2023 in three-year increments, as before (i.e., with district conventions held in 2025, 2028, etc., and Synod Conventions held in 2026, 2029, etc.).]

Vote: Yes or No."
