Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I have heard the comment already, "It is going to be a different Summer!" That can mean different things. In the context, it was how COVID-19 will shape the coming months ahead. The importance of teaching biblical creation, along with the scientific evidences that support it, can hardly be over-stated! Creation is the foundation to the entire Bible, with Genesis chapters 1 to 11 containing the teaching of the creation of a REAL Adam (not one evolved from apes), and a REAL fall into sin, requiring the need for a REAL Savior! There are over 100 references to Genesis in the New Testament, including many made by Jesus Himself. They all treat Genesis and a miraculous creation by a REAL God as actual historical events!
