Well now, that's a pretty depressing and disappointing list, isn't it? There can be no doubt that SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19 have completely disrupted our lives and the whole world. Regardless of your personal or political opinions, whether right or wrong, good or bad, it has completely disrupted our lives in every imaginable way. I suspect that your calendars and day planners look an awful lot like mine-more or less empty. Is there anything we've forgotten? Could there possibly be anything missing from this list of cancellations? I'm sure there is.

In fact, I know there is. Sin. We haven't included sin in our list. And yet sin has been very much cancelled! St. Paul writes in his letter to the Colossians, "And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with [Christ], having forgiven us all our trespasses, by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him" (2:13-15 ESV) Did you catch it? God has canceled the record of debt that stood against us. He has canceled our sin. We no longer stand condemned because our sin has been nailed to Christ's cross, our debts have all been paid, and the "rulers and authorities" that accuse us have been put to shame. Christ has defeated them. Christ has overcome them. His glorious resurrection from the dead has proven it, and you and I now stand before God cleansed, pure, forgiven, and free forever. There is absolutely nothing in this world that can steal our Easter hope or joy. They have not been canceled.

So why don't we go ahead and brainstorm a list of things that haven't been canceled. Many of you have probably seen graphics like this floating around social media. We could surely add to this list,

starting with the hope and joy that I just mentioned, and here are a few more:

CREATION (and Evolution) DVDs & BOOKS ADDED

to our St. Andrew Library!

OVER 150 DVDs & BOOKS have been added to our St. Andrew library at no cost to St. Andrew. These include Creation and other Christian Apologetics resources on loan from the personal libraries of our former DCE, Ken Koehler, as well as from several pastors and other members of our LCMS congregations in the Fargo area. They are all available for free check-out.

The importance of teaching biblical creation, along with the scientific evidences that support it, can hardly be over-stated! Creation is the foundation to the entire Bible, with Genesis chapters 1 to 11 containing the teaching of the creation of a REAL Adam (not one evolved from apes), and a REAL fall into sin, requiring the need for a REAL Savior! There are over 100 references to Genesis in the New Testament, including many made by Jesus Himself. They all treat Genesis and a miraculous creation by a REAL God as actual historical events!

New DVDs and books will be added from time to time - so continue to check the list for updates. Here are a few pointers about saving stamps:

Buy and use commemorative stamps, since they are worth more than common stamps.

Save all cancelled stamps.

Place stamps on envelope in the upper right hand corner, allowing 1/4 inch from each edge.

Stamps need not be trimmed or removed from envelopes. IF trimming from envelopes, leave at least 1/4 inch around stamp.
