# Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ;

We're waiting...waiting for the time when "this" will be over.

The Portals of Prayer devotion reminded me that we are only 9 months away from Christmas. That's not really what you or I want to think about. However, you might be wondering more about Easter.

On this March 25, when I am finishing my newsletter article, it is a little more than two weeks before Easter. It is also the Annunciation, that is the announcement to Mary that she will conceive and have a child, without a husband. Yes, 9 months before Christmas. As you read the Scriptures, you see how disrupted Mary's life became. Yet, what do we find Mary and Joseph doing all this time? They respond in their circumstances with faithfulness.

When the angel appears, she is afraid. But when God's Word comes to her, she responds, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38, ESV).

You may have suspicions why Mary left to see Elizabeth, who also was in her 6th month. Yet when Mary meets Elizabeth, Elizabeth and the baby respond in joy. "...blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord" (Luke 1:44–45, ESV).

Her fiancé, Joseph, contemplates breaking off the engagement (called divorce at that time), yet when God's Word comes to Him, takes Mary as his wife.

The Government demands being counted causing them to travel at the end of her pregnancy, and they go and the child is born in Bethlehem as foretold in the Scriptures.

They have to settle among the animals for shelter and then she gives birth. Yet, Joseph gets them into a house (Matthew 2:11), follows the customs according to the law of Moses (Luke 1:21), even making a trip to Jerusalem while their financial situation doesn't appear good (offering sacrifices as the poor - Luke 1:22-24).

Within two years, they have to flee for their lives to a foreign country (Matthew 2:13-14). Later when they return, they avoid the current government so they are safe (Matthew 2:15, 19-23).

Faithfulness comes from hearing God's Word. Trust in the promises of God. For what Mary and Joseph cared for was what was promised. What was conceived in her is the Savior, Jesus Christ, who is God and man, who would save His people from their sins (Matthew 1:21).

You see Christmas has everything to do with Holy Week and Easter. Mary as she waited those 9 months, and Joseph with all the decisions he had to make, find their peace in God's Word, especially the promises.

When you receive this newsletter, will you have about two weeks until Easter? Yes, the day will come and go, but the effects and the joy lives on. Jesus Christ did die for our sins on that Good Friday. God the Father did accepted His sacrifice by raising Him from the dead. Therefore, in Jesus our sins are forgiven, and in Jesus our resurrection is assured no matter what our circumstances are today, tomorrow and on.

As you adjust to the circumstances of Covid-19, live out faithfully the peace and joy promised in God's Word and assured by Jesus.

# CREATION (and Evolution) DVDs & BOOKS ADDED

to our St. Andrew Library!

OVER 150 DVDs & BOOKS have been added to our St. Andrew library at no cost to St. Andrew. These include Creation and other Christian Apologetics resources on loan from the personal libraries of our former DCE, Ken Koehler, as well as from several pastors and other members of our LCMS congregations in the Fargo area. They are all available for free check-out.

The importance of teaching biblical creation, along with the scientific evidences that support it, can hardly be over-stated! Creation is the foundation to the entire Bible, with Genesis chapters 1 to 11 containing the teaching of the creation of a REAL Adam (not one evolved from apes), and a REAL fall into sin, requiring the need for a REAL Savior! There are over 100 references to Genesis in the New Testament, including many made by Jesus Himself. They all treat Genesis and a miraculous creation by a REAL God as actual historical events!

Here are a few pointers about saving stamps:

Buy and use commemorative stamps, since they are worth more than common stamps.

Save all cancelled stamps.

Place stamps on envelope in the upper right hand corner, allowing 1/4 inch from each edge.

Stamps need not be trimmed or removed from envelopes. IF trimming from envelopes, leave at least 1/4 inch around stamp.
