Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Again things are changing. On August 18th we said our farewells to Director of Christian Education (DCE) Emily Leising. On Sunday August 25th, she will be installed as DCE at Heavenly Host Lutheran Church in Cookeville, TN. So where does that leave us?

First and foremost, we are still in the Word of God, hearing Law and Gospel, and our only place of confidence is in the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. As I see all that Fall brings with Confirmation, Bible Class, Sunday School, Youth Programs, and so on, Psalm 121 comes to mind, "I lift up my eyes to the hills." Those hills are challenges, even challenges to faith.

This is the least amount of called-staff that we have had since before 1975. 1975-1992 you had two. 1992-2003 you had three. 2003-2013 you had two. (A time, I would not like to go back to again.) In 2014 we added Intern Emily, and then Assistant Pastor Harvala on by the hour and activity basis. 2015 DCE Emily was called and DCE Ken retired. Now we have a little over 1 full-time pastor in a world that needs even more ministry than it did earlier. So I can say with the Psalmist, "From where does my help come?" And the answer is in verse 2, "My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth. (ESV)"

That doesn't mean that we don't do anything and wait to see what happens. The "we" isn't what's left of the staff or the council or the boards, but every member of the congregation as well. The Lord has given us various talents and gifts so He can work **through us!** Our Lord promises to work through us, just as he did in Acts 6:1–7 to bless His church. In verse two, "...the twelve summoned the full number of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should give up preaching the word of God to serve tables. Therefore, brothers, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we will appoint to this duty. But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

The Ministry of the Word was primary, and the Ministry of the Word is to remain primary among us. Therefore the Lord has set before us challenges and opportunities to move forward. Please bring these changes to the Lord in prayer. Speak to one another openly about how the Ministry will look at St. Andrew so that Word of God will continue to increase.

We don't know what that increase will look like among us, but for the early disciples in Acts 6:7, it says, "And the word of God continued to increase, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests became obedient to the faith."
