# Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

As I stood outside the cages watching my son's baseball team take batting practice on the evening following a particularly uninspiring offensive performance, I got to thinking about motivation. The head coach really got after those boys for not swinging the bats; he ruffled their feathers; he got under their skin. He challenged them. I dare say he even made them a little bit mad. And they responded. They wielded those bats like they were 22-ounce aluminum chips on their shoulders. They started swinging like they had something to prove, and I proceeded to watch them spray baseballs all around those two cages, nearly taking the head off of both of those coaches on more than a few occasions in the process. They were motivated.

What motivates you? Some people are motivated by a fear of failure. Others are motivated by the approval of others. Some people are motivated by the threat of punishment. Others by the promise of reward. And then there's that truly rare and unusual (in a good way) breed who are actually self-motivating. I know; I used to think they were a myth too, like the jackalope, but then I actually met a few of you. So I repeat, what motivates you?

Hopefully by now you're aware of some things that are going on at Saint Andrew. In case you missed it, back in April the Voters Assembly approved a three-year capital campaign with the goal of eliminating our congregational debt load. That means the mortgage on the 2006 addition, the sanctuary roofing project, and the special assessments--a combined balance of almost a half million dollars in all. What exactly that capital campaign is going to look like has yet to be determined, but one thing we do know--it will kick off on January 1, 2020. The voters have spoken. Oh, and we're only now retiring the balance on a \$30,000 shortfall loan needed to close the books on 2018.

As I write this, DCE Emily is deliberating four different calls to service in the church--one to Tennessee, one to Wisconsin, and one to Michigan, to go along with the one she is presently serving here at Saint Andrew. Where the Lord may lead her--or lead her to stay--remains to be seen. Will we have a vacancy in the position of Director of Christian Education & Youth Ministry? Will we continue to have the position of Director of Christian Education & Youth Ministry? There would be much work for the congregation to pick up and manage during the interim--or for the future. As it is, we continue to struggle to fill administrative boards. Stewardship, Outreach, Education & Elders remain in need of members--even with a full ministry staff.

Dear people of Saint Andrew, I submit to you this month that we are being challenged. How will we respond? Think back to the different ways I mentioned by which people are motivated. Which one are you? If you happen to be the type of person who's motivated by the approval of others, then know that your Heavenly Father already thinks the world of you. He is absolutely over the moon about you. There is nothing you could ever do to make him love you any more, or any less. If you happen to be the type who's motivated by the fear of failure or the threat of punishment, then know that your sins are already forgiven by God and paid for because of Christ. All of your failures and shortcomings, even the ones that still lay ahead, have been charged to Jesus' account. You don't need to be afraid. You are free to be who he has made you to be, even free to fall down and get back up again. If you happen to be the type who's motivated by the promise of a reward, then known that you already have the greatest reward imaginable--forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation in this world, and the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting in the world to come. And if you happen to be that rare breed who's self-motivated, then know that you've been given a tremendous gift from God, the Holy Spirit living inside of you, and Jesus living through you.

We are indeed being challenged in many ways. How will we, as the people of God, respond? Let's go, friends. It's time to step up, and get to work. It's time to get motivated. (But let's try to keep the "coaches' " heads intact, please. :-))

IF trimming from envelopes, leave at least 1/4 inch around stamp.

# **SUPPORTING GLS**


