Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

The **Paraclete** is the solution to avoid becoming **parasites**. So you might be unfamiliar with the word, paraclete, but if you are a pet owner letting your pet out this summer, you're all too familiar with the second word, parasite. Let's have a little fun with the words. Parasite: "para" meaning "along side of," like a "para" at school who comes along side a teacher to help with students, and "site" as in location, so "along side of a location." That "location" is my dog, and fleas and ticks are not there to help, but come "along side" of pets and suck the life out and leave. That's what a parasite does.

So why am I taking up paper on such a topic? Summer is coming. Sunday School has ended. Adult Bible Class has come to a close. Life Light's nine weeks of study is completed. Now for some self-examination about our goals for the summer. When we confessed together in worship, "I believe in the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints...," are we assuming that it means St. Andrew and everybody associated with it will be there if we ever come back? Are we assuming that what we are leaving for the summer will be there when we return in the Fall? Did we take from the church what we wanted last winter and are leaving for the summer? We don't have to verbally answer "yes" to these questions. But if we act as if our answers are "yes," we have become no better than fleas or ticks on our pet-church, a "spiritual parasite."

The world already acts as a parasite on us. It continually takes from us and wants more, but doesn't give back. Our sinful nature is all too willing to act just like the sinful "parasitic" world. However, the Lord wants and offers better for us.

The Lord gives us His Paraclete. We celebrate His coming June 9th with Pentecost. You might think of "clete" as in "cleats," but "clete" means "called," and again "para" means "along-side-of," which we know as the Holy Spirit. He is "called" along side" of us to guide us and give us life. We confess in the Nicene Creed, "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life...." In a world that would "suck" the life out of us, the Holy Spirit comes along side of us to give us life, just as the Lord God breathed into Adam the breath of life and he became a living being (Genesis 2:7). So also in John 20:22–23 (ESV), "And when [Jesus] had said this, he **breathed on them** and said to them, "**Receive the Holy Spirit**. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." Jesus' breath in the form of His Word, gives the Holy Spirit which gives the power to give or withhold the forgiveness of sins. We are reminded in the catechism that "...where there is forgiveness of sins there is life and salvation."

When we absent ourselves from the Word, we hinder the Holy Spirit from working in our lives. When we absent ourselves from the worshiping among fellow Christians, we hinder the work the Holy Spirit in the body of Christ, the church (not just our congregation). I am not saying that you have to be at St. Andrew every Sunday or even Thursday. What I am saying is that we need to pay attention to what summer plans are doing to ourselves and the rest of the body of Christ. We are not to stand in the way of the Holy Spirit's work by our absence, but find ourselves in God's presence and the presence of other Christians, receiving the Word, confessing the Word with others and supporting the Word to bring life to others.

Hebrews 10:23–25 reminds us, (ESV) "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near"

SUPPORTING GLS


