Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

"But Peter rose and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; and he went home marveling at what had happened" Luke 24:12 (ESV).

So Easter was celebrated back on the 21st of April. Notice that "celebrated" ends with an "ed." The "ed" at the end of this verb tells us that it happened in the past. It's over. It's done, and so we move on to the next. Is that your view of Easter? May be not, but do we treat the resurrection of our Lord as if it is a past action that we remember once a year and then move on with it having little effect on our present life?

What happened at Easter is more than a time for families to go to worship, eat breakfast and then have a big dinner together. Really we can do that anytime. In fact, my mother is proposing that our family get-together will be Palm Sunday Weekend next year. Our family is contemplating for the future, "Christmas in July" because...Christmas is when we are active with our "church families," besides every son is in a different state right now. Many of you are experiencing the same challenges. Many of us don't even get to go "home marveling at what happened" as Peter did that first Easter morning. We are busy traveling, preparing a meal, hosting, visiting, etc. I am not saying family is not important. Far from it! Scripture expresses the importance of family, caring for one another, especially the widowed and orphaned (e.g. 1 Timothy 5:16, 3:4-5, 3:12, James 1:27).

Peter "...went home marveling...." One part of the meaning of "marveling" is to be filled with wonder. Peter had heard the women announce that the tomb was empty and that Jesus had risen, but to Peter and those with him, it seemed like non-sense. He went and saw the evidence of the empty tomb and "he went home marveling at what had happened." Here's more grammar that may be helpful. "Marveling" is an present active participle. That means the word is dependent on the main verb and so we know that's what Peter did as he "went home." "Had happened" is a perfect active participle. Perfect means that the effects or results of what happened continue. May be complicated? It just means that Jesus resurrection didn't just happen and it was over, but the effects continue to impact the present and into the future.

Just like there are the 12 days of Christmas, the effects of the resurrection extends for 7 weeks and on the 50th day after we celebrate Pentecost, the good news of the resurrection going out to all people, different languages and people groups! That's the big picture and it is still happening.

Paul explains what the resurrection means for us on a personal level in Romans 6:1–11 (ESV), "What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus."

That's the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ ever day of our lives!...even beyond the month of April and May!
