Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Psalm 34:8, 11 (ESV) "Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good! Blessed is the man who takes refuge in him!.. Come, O children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the LORD."

Psalm 34 invites all to taste and see that the Lord is good. What kind of memorable flavor are we leaving in our children's mouths about the Lord? What is your attitude toward worship? Is it rubbing off on your children, grandchildren and even your grandchildren? Children live in the moment. They are making connections in their minds between what they see and hear, even when they are playing and we think they are not paying attention. So what we adults and teenagers do with Sunday morning has a big impression on little minds. Those impressions last a life time. This is not just in worship, when we are paying attention or not paying attention, but as we prepare or don't prepare to go to worship.

Do the next generations get the impression from us that the Lord is indeed good and that He provides good things? Or are we leaving a bad or bland taste in their mouth? A bland taste is when we don't care or act like we don't care. A bad taste can be how we handle arguments and bad things in our lives. These can happen easily before going to church. What is important is what we do with them! But in Christ those events can be turned into good. For example saying to the child, "We need to go to church especially this morning to pray for the Lord's strength for us to work this out." or "We need to go to church because mommy or daddy or both say we do" or "We all need God's forgiveness. We want to do better."

Psalm 34 invites children to learn the fear of the Lord. Because of our sinful nature, we easily take a narrow view of fear, which is being afraid of what can hurt us. This is what 1 John 4:18 (ESV) says, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love." If we have done wrong then fear should be a natural reaction. But the kind of fear in Psalm 34, as well as the meanings to the commandments, is also awe and reverence and so we will want to do our best in our lives.

But what about when we are afraid because we have done something wrong? Psalm 130:4 (ESV) states, "But with you there is forgiveness, that you may be feared." It is up to God whether He is going to forgive us or not. He's also the only one that can forgive us and keep us out of hell and He only has promised that forgiveness in Jesus. Here's how 1 John 2:1–2 (ESV) says it, "My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world."

Rather than letting wrong doing, hurt, that is sin, having a bitter taste, let it lead us to Jesus Christ to confess it and to receive forgiveness for it. Indeed then the Lord will be seen as good for generations to come.

SHORTFALL LOAN 2017

In 2017, giving to the General Fund income was \$6.000.00 short of covering expenses. The Mortgage Fund income was \$11,000.00 short of covering the loan payments. This year we had to take out a Shortfall Loan for \$17,000.00 to cover the difference for the Mortgage Fund and the General Fund. As of June, the 2017 Shortfall Loan balance is \$9,030.00.
