SHORTFALL LOAN 2017

In 2017, giving to the General Fund income was \$6.000.00 short of covering expenses. The Mortgage Fund income was \$11,000.00 short of covering the loan payments. This year we had to take out a Shortfall Loan for \$17,000.00 to cover the difference for the Mortgage Fund and the General Fund. As of June, the 2017 Shortfall Loan balance is \$9,855. We are asking all to consider any additional giving they can contribute to eliminate the shortfall loan.
