Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

May it is age...may be it is times, but it seems as the years go by thanksgiving is so disconnected from Thanksgiving Day. Many travel. Many are wrapped up in food preparations, preparing for company and football games. Our congregation plans worship for the evening before, but many aren't there. Will they worship some place else? Will there be a prayer before and after the meal? We may notice that those who don't ever go to church have the same and even more stuff than those who do.

Our Lord already knew the temptation of people being thankless. In Deuteronomy 8 Moses taught, "When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the Lord your God for the good land He has given you. Be careful that you do not forget the Lord your God, failing to observe His commands, His laws and His decrees...You may say to yourself, 'My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me.' But remember the Lord your God, for it is He who gives you're the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms His covenant, which swore to your forefathers, as it is today."

Even we pray over and over again in the Lord's Prayer, "Give us this day our daily bread." Luther teaches us what does this mean? "God certainly gives daily bread to everyone, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving." Do other people, even non-church goers, have plenty? Many do (Matthew 5:45). I have wondered why myself, and then I am reminded that if didn't have what they need and they came to recognized the existence of God, they may look at Him as a tyrant and be all the more angry at Him, rather than seeing His gracious provision.

What does it take for people to be thankful, especially to God? It takes His Word, by it His Spirit work to change hearts from thankless stone, to living thankful hearts.

Isaiah 55:6–7 (ESV) says, "Seek the LORD while he may be found; call upon him while he is near; let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the LORD, that He may have compassion on him, and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon."
