The Gospel in Seven Words

... Is our Lenten Series

The author of this series is Dr. Peter Nafzger of Concordia Seminary-St. Louis. He writes as edited by Pastor Jahnke, "... Lent is all about the Gospel. Every year we set aside 40 days to reflect, repent, and recall the love God has shown us in Christ. Every year we pause to ponder the passion of our Savior. Every year, preachers try to put into words the incredible news that God does not judge us for our sins, but that in Christ, He grants us forgiveness, life, and salvation.

But what will you say this year? If you were asked to summarize the Gospel in a few short words, which would you choose...to confess the faith confidently and clearly...? What if, this year, in addition to considering the seven words of Christ from the cross, we work together to confess the Gospel using only seven words?

2017 will mark the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Throughout this year Lutherans around the world will celebrate Luther's bold confession of the Gospel. That makes this a great time to be encouraged and equipped as Lutheran men, women, and children to confess our faith using our own words. That's the purpose of this Lenten series.

The series...explores ways we confess our faith as Lutheran Christians. 1 Peter 3:15 provides the foundation for the series as it prepares us to be ready to give the reason for our hope in Christ.

ASH WEDNESDAY COMMUNION

On Ash Wednesday, March 1, there will be the imposition of ashes offered as a part of our confession of sins. If you do not desire the ashes to be placed on your head, you are encouraged to remain in your pew in prayer. There also will be Holy Communion with individual cups and the common cup. It is a good practice to prepare yourself either by the Christian Questions and Answers found in your Luther's Small Catechism or in your hymnal (p. 329-30). There is also a prayer in the front cover of your hymnal before approaching the communion rail. When the pastor addresses you with a bow, you respond with a bow meaning, "I have examined myself and I believe in and am ready to receive the blessed body and blood of Christ." Hold out your non-dominant hand (usually the dominant one is under) and the host/ bread will be placed in your hand. If you are holding a child or can only use one hand the pastor will place the host closer to the end of your fingers. If you need gluten free-please contact the pastor before the service. If you are receiving by individual cups please hang on to your cup until the common cup has passed. When receiving the common cup, please hold the base of the cup guiding and tipping it to your lips. There is also de-alcoholized wine, which is lighter in color for those who have such concerns.

RESURRECTION EGGS

The Board of Christian Outreach will be handing out Resurrection Eggs during the lent season. This is a fun way to learn about the upcoming events of Holy Week. Empty egg cartons will be handed out during the GROW session on Feb 26 to decorate the outside. Eggs will be given out on the following dates: Ash Wed through Palm Sun. March 1, 5, 8, 12, 15, 19, 22, 26, 29 & April 2, 5, & 9. Each egg will come with its own story. This is open to all ages, but highly encouraged for families with young children to teach them about the Holy Week events. One set of Resurrection eggs per family. We hope that this will bring excitement into each family this Lent & Easter season with the Resurrection Story through Easter eggs.

BATH, BEAUTY, AND BUBBLES

Spring is near and time to freshen up! Pantry donations needed for non-food items beginning March 1st. A list of needed items will be located at the donation area near the east entrance. Toothbrushes that are not individually wrapped will need to be placed in sandwich bags to avoid contamination. We are still accepting food donations as well. Thank you for allowing families to feel good about themselves and alleviate some of the stress of everyday living!

NEWS FROM BOARDS OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees is busy with two projects that are going to get started in the near future. Project #1 is replacing the 40+ year-old shingles on the main sanctuary. After last fall's hailstorm, a claim was filed with Church Mutual, our insurance carrier. They are still finalizing our claim, but have notified the church that funds will be forthcoming toward replacement of the shingles. The Board has been consulting with Western Products regarding the best type of replacement shingle and the overall general condition of the main sanctuary roof. The current consensus is to install a steel shingle that has a 50year warranty. The Western Products proposal includes installing insulation over the entire sanctuary roof and replacing all shingles with the new steel shingle. They would remove the current cedar siding on the north and south exterior sides and replace with steel siding. Finally they would reseal all the windows at the roof peak and install steel siding and insulation around those windows. Photos of some of Western Products' previous projects and a color sample are on the information tables in the narthex.

Project #2 is replacing the existing heat pumps servicing the north end of the addition. These heat pumps heat and cool the education classrooms, the office area, the fellowship hall and the narthex. The HVAC system is currently configured for three heat pumps to service these areas. At this time, one heat pump has failed and is non-functional, and another is functioning properly about 70% of the time. The third one is a used heat pump recently installed to replace another failed unit and get us through the winter. The used unit already has 10 years of service and was a temporary "band aid" offered up by our geothermal contractor. The plan is to replace all three heat pumps with one unit that can handle the entire load. The new unit would be very similar to the replacement heat pump we installed a few years ago in the south mechanical room.

Based on the current cost estimates for both projects, and after considering the estimated funds from the insurance claim, the Board is anticipating an approximate \$80,000 cash outlay to complete all this work. There have been some preliminary discussions with Lutheran Church Extension Fund (our current mortgage holder) about a loan to finance these projects. The Board will update the congregation with more news and financing options, once the insurance claim is finalized.
