Pastors Soundings in the Trumpeter...

As I write this, we have just inaugurated our forty-fifth President. On Friday, January 20th, Donald J. Trump was sworn into this nation's highest public office, and many citizens of these United States of America are rejoicing. Many others are terrified and/or angry. And still others probably didn't even notice, though it is an important day in our civic life together every four years, which means we won't see it again now for another four years. So with that out of the way, we can finally move on to the most important day of not only every four years, but of every year-Groundhog's Day. That's right, on the 2nd of February people all across this great nation will be glued to their television sets and radios, watching and listening with eager anticipation to learn whether or not the venerable Punxsutawney Phil will emerge from his burrow to be greeted by his shadow, or if the ground beneath him be bathed in nothing but the lukewarm glow of a Pennsylvania sunrise. Will we, the people of these United States, be blessed to celebrate the early arrival of spring, or will we, like Phil, be forced to tuck our tails between our legs and run, retreating, back into our cozy, warm dens to tough out another six dreaded weeks of winter?

As believers in the one true God, we can have fun with the idea of Groundhog's Day and everything that it entails, all while not believing even for a moment that the Almighty actually takes his orders from rodents. And yet the church does celebrate on the 2nd of February. Not (St.) Groundhog's Day, mind you, but the Presentation of Jesus and the Purification of Mary. You can do the math. Count forty days from the day on which we celebrate the birth of our Lord, and you will find that 25 (December) + 40 = 2 (February). Why forty days? Because that was the time table set by God in the Old Testament, the duration of a mother's ceremonial uncleanness following the birth of a son (Leviticus 12:1-4). The Scripture teaches us in the account of this event in Jesus' life that all of this was done to fulfill what was written in the Law. Such great emphasis does the Scripture place on this point, in fact, that Saint Luke makes no less than five references to the "the Law of Moses" or "the Law of the Lord" in recording it (Luke 2:22-40).

What does all of this mean? It means that from the moment of his conception by the Holy Spirit, Jesus had only one thing on his mind-the will of his heavenly Father. We learn from this that, even in his infancy, Jesus is the sinless Son of God, who will fulfill the whole will and Law of God for us who cannot. He would submit himself to the will of the Father, obeying everything that he would be asked to do. And as we prepare to begin next month the season of Lent once again, we are reminded that the will of the Father for Jesus also included a cross. When faced with the shadowy bleakness of a lifetime of carrying the world's sin, and sacrificing himself as payment for that sin, Jesus-unlike Punxsutawney Phil-did not tuck his tail between his legs and go into hiding. He bore it all, and fulfilled it all, so that you and I can enjoy an endless summer in the warmth and light of God's forgiveness and salvation. Whatever our circumstances may be in this life-whether it means six more weeks of winter or the joy of an early thaw; whether you love your new President or loathe him, we rest safe and secure in the arms of our Savior, who has "done everything required by the Law of the Lord" for us. Enjoy your Groundhog's Day, in Jesus' name.


HELP YOUR ELDERS IMPROVE COMMUNICATION & MEMBERSHIP

NEWS FROM BOARDS OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees is busy with two projects that are going to get started in the near future. Project #1 is replacing the 40+ year-old shingles on the main After last fall's hailstorm, a claim was filed with Church Mutual, our insurance carrier. They are still finalizing our claim, but have notified the church that funds will be forthcoming toward replacement of the shingles. The Board has been consulting with Western Products regarding the best type of replacement shingle and the overall general condition of the main sanctuary roof. The current consensus is to install a steel shingle that has a 50-year warranty. The Western Products proposal includes installing insulation over the entire sanctuary roof and replacing all shingles with the new steel shingle. They would remove the current cedar siding on the north and south exterior sides and replace with steel siding. Finally they would reseal all the windows at the roof peak and install steel siding and insulation around those windows. Photos of some of Western Products' previous projects and a color sample are on the information tables in the narthex.

Project #2 is replacing the existing heat pumps servicing the north end of the addition. These heat pumps heat and cool the education classrooms, the office area, the fellowship hall and the narthex. The HVAC system is currently configured for three heat pumps to service these areas. At this time, one heat pump has failed and is non-functional, and another is functioning properly about 70% of the time. The third one is a used heat pump recently installed to replace another failed unit and get us through the winter. The used unit already has 10 years of service and was a temporary "band aid" offered up by our geothermal contractor. The plan is to replace all three heat pumps with one unit that can handle the entire load. The new unit would be very similar to the replacement heat pump we installed a few years ago in the south mechanical room.

Based on the current cost estimates for both projects, and after considering the estimated funds from the insurance claim, the Board is anticipating an approximate \$80,000 cash outlay to complete all this work. There have been some preliminary discussions with Lutheran Church Extension Fund (our current mortgage holder) about a loan to finance these projects. The Board will update the congregation with more news and financing options, once the insurance claim is finalized.
