Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

The conversations are longer after the past year. People continue talk right up to the time of the service. People talk long after the worship services. Some talk after the lights are out & the doors have been locked. This phenomena demonstrates our need for being social, being a part of a community. That need has been constrained over the past year, & it wants to be fulfilled.

When the need for community can't be filled in normal ways we find substitutes: Face-Time, Messenger, Skype, Teams, Zoom, Webex. So we did for worship: Mainstreet Living, Facebook, YouTube, etc. But we need to recognize them for what they are; they are "substitutes." They are the "not yets," which means we do not yet have the full expression of being with others. There's nothing like being there, face-to-face. Many of our shut-ins underst& this all too well. We, as pastors, see the joy on their faces & in their words when we bring Holy Communion to them.

Holy Communion is the ultimate community we have on this side of eternity. We are communing with God & with one another through the body & blood of Jesus Christ. Holy Communion is the highest expression of the church & its unity. There, we are to have put down anything we have against one another. There we are assured God holds nothing against us. It has all been settled with the body & blood of Jesus. It is forgiveness. By faith we believe it & know it.

But there is also a bit of grieving with Holy Communion. First, for what it cost. It cost God His only Son & our brother, Jesus Christ. It cost Him to be judged & put to death because of our sin. Second, Holy Communion is still a "not yet," we still do not have the full expression of being the presence of God, though now we have it by grace through faith. We are grieving over what we lost since Adam. We are to be yearning for what we only have now by faith.

Psalm 137:1 expresses this grieving & yearning, "By the waters of Babylon, there we sat down & wept, when we remembered Zion" (ESV). Zion was the "now, not yet" of the presence of God. The Today, Church is the new Zion, the "now, not yet" of the presence of God. Holy Communion is ultimate expression of the "now, not yet" presence of God. Our souls should not only grieve but yearn for the presence of God so much that we are drawn to be with His people & where He has promised to be.

Continue to pray for those who are hindered or hindering themselves from gathering with God's people around Word & Sacrament. Think about & act on plans for them or yourselves to be reconnected with God's community, the church. In Christ, we are set free from the debilitating of the effects of sin. On this side of eternity, by faith in Christ, we can start to deal with isolation, disappointments, loss, depression, addictions, even facing our deaths. In Christ, these are all temporary.

Contrast Psalm 137 with Psalm 126:1–2, "When the LORD brought back the captives to Zion, we were like men who dreamed. 2 Our mouths were filled with laughter, our tongues with songs of joy. Then it was said among the nations, "The LORD has done great things for them" (NIV84). After this year the conversations are longer, but they are nothing compared to what is to come for us in Christ Jesus!
