Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the Lord,' and my right is disregarded by my God"? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might he increases strength. Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint. ~Isaiah 40:27-31

Who's ready for winter to be over? I know I am. There's just something about winter that has a way of wearing on people, especially in our area. It's an ongoing season of short days and long nights, cold weather, and-this year especially-loads of snow. By the time we get to March, I don't know about you, but I'm usually ready for it to be done. It just has a way of wearing on people, and we could use some renewal of the weather.

Couple that with the surplus of other challenges and struggles that life just has a way of throwing at us. Health concerns, financial struggles, work pressure, family stress, political maneuvering, threat of war. It reminds of the cry of a child who thought the ride would be fun, but about halfway in begins to scream, "Stop this roller coaster; I want to get off!" Sometimes we just need to stop and take a little break. We sure could use some renewal in our lives.

This Lent, we'll get just that. Beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd, we'll join in worship and meditation based on the theme, "Lent-A Time for Renewal." Throughout the six weeks of this solemn and penitential season, we'll take some time to consider Lent as a time for renewal of servanthood, of obedience, of witness, of true religion, of priorities, and of godly fear. Then, in Holy Week, we'll observe Maundy Thursday as a time for renewal of Christian unity; we'll remember our Lord's Passion on Good Friday as a time for renewal of faith; and finally, we'll celebrate Easter as a time for renewal of hope. Because that's what we ultimately truly need-a little bit of hope to get us through this life and to prepare us for the life of the world to come.

It's easy during Lent to allow the solemnity and the sorrow to crowd out joy and hope, just as it's easy for winter to drag on, with seemingly no end in sight, and sapping us of our strength. Yet even as I write this, with the mountains of snow surrounding me and a chill still hanging in the air (okay; that's an understatement), the days are already beginning to lengthen noticeably. Every day, there's just a little more sunshine; every day, there's just a little more light. A sure sign that warmer days and happier times are coming. Our Lord blesses us with just enough of what we need to get through. That's what the means of grace are all about. Through his Word and Sacraments, our Lord Jesus Christ blesses us with exactly what we need to get through whatever season of life we are in.

Please join us in worship every Wednesday from March 2nd through April 7th. We'll gather as a family to enjoy a delicious meal served by the various boards and officers of our congregation beginning at 5:15pm, followed by worship at 6:30. And may our gracious God makes this Lent a time for renewal for you.

SHORTFALL LOAN

As of January 1, 2022 our shortfall loan is \$53,736.39. This year we have a balance 25% smaller than the previous balance of \$72,170. We paid off last year's shortfall loan in September. Between September & December a separate FFT campaign raised over \$125k for debt reduction, paid off our roof loan, & shortened our mortgage payoff time line! Contributions & pledges continue to come in for our congregation's Faithfully Forward Together Debt Reduction Campaign as we enter our second year. We are currently at \$131,827.55 received of over-&-above regular giving, plus another \$11,300 pledged toward our total goal of \$375,000! THANK YOU & to God be the Glory!

As reported in last month's newsletter, & figuring today's interest rates, this has saved us over \$15,000 in interest by paying off the entire balance for our sanctuary shingling & insulation project, plus a significant portion of the debt from our 2005 building expansion. However, as you may know, it appears that interest rates will be going up soon. With this in mind, the sooner we can further reduce our mortgage debt, the more our interest savings!

We hope that you have seen the series of short videos that our FFT committee created to explain the many advantages of our building expansion & sanctuary roof project - but if you missed any of them, or perhaps wish to view them again, they are available to view through our St. Andrew website at www.standrewlcms.org.
