Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

If April showers bring May flowers, what do May flowers br— Nope. Not going there. Though I do wonder, what do April tornadoes and blizzards bring?

As I looked out the window recently, I couldn't help but think, "Creation is angry." Of course, it also happened to be Earth Day, a time when we hear plenty about pollution, carbon footprints, emission, and climate change. I certainly believe we as God's people are to be good stewards of creation, but I'm no environmentalist. My concern is of a theological nature. St. Paul instructs the Romans, "For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now" (Romans 8:22 ESV). That's what I observed as I looked out my window that day. A creation groaning like the snaps, crackles, and pops of an aging body or the clunk and thunk of a car on its last leg.

But what is this creation groaning for? Paul tells us: the revealing of the sons of God. Creation itself waits for it, longs for it even. The whole world, he writes, has been "subjected to futility...in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God" (Romans 8:20-21 ESV). Do you grasp that? God's creation suffers on account of man's sin. But man's redemption is also creation's redemption. Christ has died; Christ has risen; Christ will come again. Not just for human beings, but for the very ground we walk on, the water we drink, and the air we breathe. Those who are the "sons of God" will be revealed when Jesus comes again. Then it will be plain; then all will know. In the meantime creation is angry, hurting, moaning, and groaning. Are you?

Throughout this Easter season as we continue to hear the testimony of the Scriptures and the Church that "Christ is risen; he is risen indeed. Alleluia!" we get to hear a series of readings from the book of Revelation. Those readings, that book, and this season all reach their climax in these words of Revelation 21:

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away. And he who was seated on the throne said, 'Behold, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.' And he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment. The one who conquers will have this heritage, and I will be his God and he will be my son.'"

Many of us have been wondering, longing even, when this crazy winter is going to come to an end once and for all. Dear people of God, take heart. Brighter days are coming. The groaning will cease. Our Lord will come again and restore us and all creation. Until then, he simply says, "Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10 ESV). For he is faithful, and he will surely do it.

Kicked off September 26, 2021 Goal of \$375,000 to retire both loans.

PHASE I TOTAL FUNDS RAISED \$128,697

PLUS, TOTAL OF FUNDS PLEDGED - \$11,300 AS OF 12/31/2021

WITH THESE FUNDS WE PAID:

- 9/29/21 \$42,592 Shingles/Roof payoff
- 10/06/21 \$20,000 Mortgage Principal Payment
- 10/18/2 \$1,637.50 Campaign printing/postage
- 11/08/21 \$15,000 Mortgage Principal Payment
- 11/08/21 \$15,600 Earmarked toward our Mortgage Loan payments for 2022. Usually we are transferring \$2300/month from our Operating Account to the Mortgage Account to help cover our monthly payments because we don't receive enough donations in each month. Now only \$1000/month will be transferred because the FFT funds will be covering the rest.
- 12/23/21 \$25,000 Mortgage Principal Payment

PHASE II

New Goal of \$251,940 to retire the balance of our Mortgage Loan

We did a soft implementation of Phase II at the beginning of 2022 with plans to formally kick off a FFT Phase II Campaign this fall.

- Current Funds collected 4/17/22 \$3,295
- Combined FFT funds collected to date total \$131,993
- Balance of funds pledged remaining \$10,695
- 2/27/22 \$10,000 Mortgage Principal Payment

INTERESTING INFORMATION:

- By paying off the Shingles/Roof loan over 5½ years early, we saved \$5,299.79 in interest.
- We have made \$70,000 in principal payments to our mortgage loan since the start of this campaign.
- Because of these payments, we have saved \$11,523 in interest!
- When we first started, our last payment was to be June 25, 2026. Our last payment on this loan is now a partial payment due May 25, 2025.
- We have eliminated one full year on the term of this loan!
- If we formally start Phase II of this campaign in September of 2022 our loan balance will be \$190,907.
- We received 78 total donations from individuals/ families for this campaign.
- There were 8 who donated more than once.
- We have received over 700 views to our videos from this campaign posted to our St. Andrew website, www.standrewlcms.org. These YouTube videos are unlisted links. They will not show up in a search. Only someone with the link can view the video. Therefore, the view numbers represent actual engagement by our members on YouTube.

Your Faithfully Forward Together committee thanks the members of St. Andrew for your generous financial response. You have helped to spread the message about what a great facility we have here at St. Andrew. You've energized the sense of community and togetherness of our Christian congregation — a family of God, gathered together to hear His Word and to serve our fellow man.

We thank and praise God from whom all blessings flow! Phase I of the campaign is done; and as we keep moving into Phase II, your continued over-and-above donations will bring the day closer when we can be debt free of our mortgage, and more able to concentrate on our other and new ministries!
