Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

This morning Sharon and Emmett Wilson dropped off a plaque with Exodus 15:2 inscribed on it. "The LORD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation." This verse is a part of a triumphant song. Moses and the people of Israel sang this after passing through the Red Sea and being delivered from the Egyptians. Without the Lord nothing is possible. We owe Him not only our very existence, but also our deliverance from the bondage that leads to death. Through Jesus Christ we have also received life!

30 years of service to St. Andrew also means this will be my 30th summer here. Most of the time the attendance dwindles starting in May in hopes that it will increase once again in September. Summer is short. With the cold May weather, it seems we are being threaten with Summer even being shorter.

As a congregation we have involved ourselves in Bible study and the first three sessions. We are looking forward to assembling the team, the support team and working together. Keep this program in your prayers and be involved because we know, "The LORD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation."

Here are a few pointers about saving stamps: Buy and use commemorative stamps, since they are worth more than common stamps. Save all cancelled stamps. Place stamps on envelope in the upper right hand corner, allowing 1/4 inch from each edge. Stamps need not be trimmed or removed from envelopes. IF trimming from envelopes, leave at least 1/4 inch around stamp.

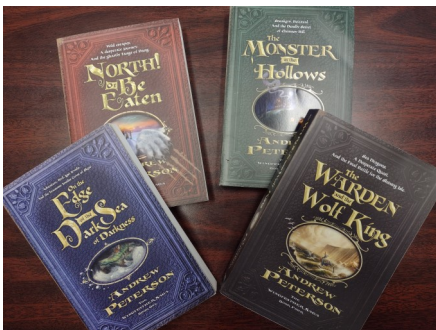
LCMS YOUTH GATHERING
