Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Ever been in a heated argument? The end result can be deadly. We pray it never gets to the point of physical death, but an argument certainly can kill a relationship.

Ever want avoid an argument? My answer is certainly yes, and I pray that yours is too! However, it is easy to conclude that the way to avoid an argument is to avoid the other person. Scripture has better advice. Actually, it is more than advice. It is being who you are in Christ. It is remembering our baptisms, "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4, ESV).

What does this newness of life look like? Colossians 3 has a lot to say, "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God." (Colossians 3:1, ESV). Check the rest of it out especially these words, "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." (Colossians 3:12 –17, ESV).

Hey Everyone!

By the time you read this newsletter, you should have received the direct mail brochure launching Phase II of our Faithfully Forward Together campaign. Phase I was a huge success and we managed to pay off a lot of our debt and lower our mortgage by a bunch! So, 2023 is our chance to finally be a debt-free congregation. That means no more having to come up with the pesky \$6,800 monthly mortgage payment and hopefully no more shortfall loans.

We'll be in a way better position as a church community to operate debt-free. But, to make this happen, we need your continued support for our regular General Fund giving. Our FFT campaign relies on your extra "Over and Above" giving donations to help reduce our debt. Please prioritize your regular giving and consider making a special gift to FFT to help us eliminate our debit in 2023.

What is our Phase II Goal?

Dec 2022 year-end Total Debt \$173,000
Jan 2023, in addition to our scheduled monthly loan payment of \$6,386, we made a \$32,000 principal payment. **Total Debt is now down to \$135,000**.

That is quite a distance we've traveled since our Phase I start of \$375,000. Check out our Phase II direct mailer to get all the details. We have copies at the Church if you didn't receive one!

We've been richly blessed by God during this campaign. We trust it may be His will to help us totally eliminate the balance this year!

Our 2023 budget calls for monthly income of \$32,800 and we beat that goal by several thousand dollars. Our Mortgage Fund Income was strong. January was also the month we benefited from a one-time adjustment made by our benefits provider (Concordia Plan Services). CPS changed their billing cycle, so in 2023 we'll get 11 months of premium bills, not 12. Having no premium payment in January saved us \$4,800.
