Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Susan, I, and our whole family thank you for your many heartfelt words and actions expressed in person, through cards and calls concerning the loss of our grandson, Micah Jax Jahnke. We are thankful for the abundant support you have given. What a blessing to have such a church family.

Micah passed from this life on Thursday, March 16, 2023. He was born that same day to our son, Nathan, and Faith (Winings) Jahnke of Batavia, IL at Northwestern Delnor Hospital, Geneva, IL. His coming brought much joy, but his little life was short and his departure was with deep sorrow, especially for his parents. However, the Lord granted him the gift of baptism in the sight of his parents after being transferred to Central DuPage Hospital and his life quickly departed.

In faith, we commend Micah to the Lord's mercy, grace and care because of the commands and promises of our Savior Jesus Christ. We are confident that His Word does what it says. We believe He has heard, hears and answers our prayers because of Jesus, for He grants whatever we ask in His Name (John 14:13, 15:16, 16:23). We know that the name of Jesus and His command to pray in His name is no magical formula. However, His name is to know His will and to understand His will. It is to trust that our Lord is good and gives the ultimate good to those who trust in Him. How else could Job in 1:21 bless the Lord saying, (ESV), "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return. The LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD." Job said this as he grieved over the loss of his 7 children (1:20). The devotion we read from the Portals of Prayer on the day Micah was born and while he was living was from Job 1. I am reminded that Job, also in his deep despair, turned to the Lord with his deepest concerns and questions. Though greatly humbled, even by the Lord, the Lord granted Him great faith and promises the same for us.

Therefore, we can also bring every concern and question to our heavenly Father. I am reminded of the LSB Hymn #770,

- 1. What a friend we have in Jesus, All our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry Ev'rything to God in prayer!
- 2. Have we trials and temptations? Is there trouble anywhere? We should never be discouraged—Take it to the Lord in prayer. Can we find a friend so faithful Who will all our sorrows share? Jesus knows our ev'ry weakness—Take it to the Lord in prayer.
- 3. Are we weak and heavy laden, Cumbered with a load of care? Precious Savior, still our refuge—Take it to the Lord in prayer. Do thy friends despise, forsake thee? Take it to the Lord in prayer. In His arms He'll take and shield thee; Thou wilt find a solace there.

You will notice that I have taken out a part of verse one. It is not because it isn't true, but because we have taken Micah's situation to the Lord in prayer. Many people, such as yourselves, prayed and are praying. However, when we are ready, these words will be a constant reminder for the days, weeks, and years that we all will live after Micah's short life, "Oh, what peace we often forfeit; Oh, what needless pain we bear—All because we do not carry Ev'rything to God in prayer!"

Jesus, who is the only way to the Father and the only way we can call God, our Father, is our hope, not only for eternal life, but also for the resurrection of the body. We are reminded as we pray the Lord's Prayer calling on "Our Father, who art in heaven," "With these words, God tenderly invites us to believe He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children as their dear father." And, "...that I should be certain that these petitions are pleasing to our Father in heaven, and are heard by Him, for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Amen, amen means 'yes, yes, it shall be so."

Our February giving was a mixed bag. The General Fund finished in the black for the 2nd month in a row, which was good. However, regular giving to the Mortgage Fund was down at \$2,119. (In 2022, we averaged \$2,900 a month.) The money we have in our Mortgage Fund (which we like to keep around \$20,000) has now slipped to \$16,613 because we needed to use over \$4,000 in the fund to help make our February payment. This account is what we will also use to pay off our Mortgage Loan balance when that time comes.



By making two large principal payments to our Mortgage Loan so far in 2023, we have saved over \$1,400.00 in interest.

Plus, we have shortened the term of the loan. It was originally scheduled to be paid off in May of 2025.

It's now September of 2024!

It is within our reach to pay off the loan this year. Especially with no Shortfall loan to overcome first.


