# Our Theme: "Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending!"

A native of Tarsus of Cilicia, Paul was "a Hebrew of Hebrews," a Pharisee and well advanced in Judaism beyond many of his peers (Philippians 3:5–6). His initial reaction to the newly formed Christian movement was to zealously persecute it (Acts 8:1). Paul's dramatic conversion while on the road to Damascus was clearly a life-altering event, changing him from being one of early Christianity's most ardent persecutors to being one of its most fervent supporters (Acts 9).

We begin Advent with Paul's very first letter, 1 Thessalonians, whose main theme is Christ's Second Coming. I invite you to come, sit at the feet of the blessed apostle, as he points us to the sure and certain hope that Jesus will come again "with clouds descending!"

# 2024 BUDGET APPROVED

The SALC Voters Assembly approved the proposed 2024 Budget of \$396,212 at the meeting held on Sunday, Nov. 19th. This is a conservative increase of only \$3,000 from our 2023 budget. If our church realizes the 2024 income and expense goals, SALC could potentially achieve a modest Net "In the Black" earnings of approximately \$13,000 at year end. It would be great if we could increase the yearly giving amount, but the income goal of \$396,212 is realistic based on average donations received over the past six years. Right now, our 2023 budget calls for \$32,808 of income per month. In 2024, the monthly goal bumps up to \$33,018, which should be obtainable. 2024 will be the first year without a Mortgage Loan. However, we did need to take out a smaller roof repair loan of \$49,000 in October. have already made great gains on that repayment (see the FFT Update article) and there is a possibility of even paying it off in 2024.

Maybe you think of the number of candles we get to light each week and how there's a lone pink one amidst the other blue ones. Or perhaps, you just think of those chocolate calendars that you get to open each day.

To many of us, Advent is a season of anticipation! We are excited to hear all our favorite Christmas hymns, we countdown the days until Christmas day and opening presents, and we all can't help but play with a nativity set when we see one. We also reflect on how people waited thousands of years for the Savior to be born, and how He was born in a lowly manger. It is so special to look back and think of the long-awaited Messiah being born as a precious little baby. How could we not get excited that the God of Heaven and Earth showed Himself to us and filled His people again with hope? Advent is a special time to remember that Christ came down for us that day, is here with us even now though we can't see Him, and that He is coming again!
