# Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

What just happened?

The Bach Cantata Vespers using Evening Prayer on Sunday, February 18. This worship service was a part of our commitment to use our Rogers organ for community outreach at least once a year. Evening Prayer was from the Lutheran Service Book (LSB p. 243-254), a more contemporary setting (c1978 & 2006) than the Anglican style Vespers service (LSB p. 229). The Bach Cantata BWV 106 was the highlight replacing the preaching section of the service. Whether you were there or not, I would encourage you to make the words of this Cantata a part of your meditation at least once or even for a week.

The bulletin notes state, "Bach scholar Alfred Dürr praises *Gottes Zeit ist die allerbeste Zeit* (Actus Tragicus) as "a work of genius such as even great masters seldom achieve." One of Bach's earliest cantatas, it was composed around 1707 for a funeral. Of the cantata texts, Dürr writes,

"The contents fall into two distinct parts: death under the Law and under the Gospel. The first part [movement II] touches on the theme of death, proceeding from general reflections on God and temporality. With increasing urgency it warns of the inevitability of death, culminating in the lapidary [a jeweler's work] statement 'It is the Old Covenant, man you must die'. Here the turning point is reached: under the Gospel, death has lost its sting and brings the desired union with Jesus, which man can await with confidence."

Think about this; death is such an unnatural state in God's perfect harmonious creation and for his crowing creation, man. Because of the forsaking of God's Word for another word, that is of the serpent, our first parents and all of humanity since then were placed outside of God's Sabbath rest. God rested from His creating and placed it under humanity's dominion. What a joy to live in that creative Word knowing all is provided for. Outside of that Word is the breaking of that trust, causing guilt, shame, worry and all that leads to death. It's what touches us all, and what we must face. However, the Word became flesh (John 1:14) and reached the goal; Jesus said, "It is finished" and died on the cross (John 19:30) and rested (buried) in the tomb. Jesus reached the Sabbath rest, not just for Himself, but available for all who trust in Him. Therefore, Hebrews 4:9 says, (ESV) "So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God...." "Death has become my sleep," Martin Luther writes in his Chorale, which is incorporated into the Cantata by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). Since death becomes sleep because of Jesus, then we and all who trust in Him will be awakened when He returns. Because of Jesus, we look forward to be awakened from the dead, which we will celebrate this Easter (March 31<sup>st</sup>). Bach in response to the good news of Jesus Christ incorporates a Chorale by Adam Reusner, praising our Trinitarian God and Lord, and then expanding thee last words, "Through Jesus Christ. Amen "for three pages of joyous praise.

- General Fund Income for January was \$32,877. Our 2024 annual budget is \$396,612, which means we have a monthly income goal of \$33,051. This money is used to cover normal operating expenses like payroll, utilities, missions, maintenance, etc. We were just short of reaching our goal for January by \$164.
- We had a few unusual expenses in January such as conference registration for the Board of Ed and travel expenses for Pastor's Pre-Lent Conference in Mandan. No snow removal has helped our expense budget immensely.
- Our month end results were a modest \$1,485 of net revenue. It's great to have a positive monthly balance and a good way to start this new year. Our specials were paid off in December as well, so we will not have that larger expense item coming up.

# <u>1-1-1 MISSION GIVING</u>

It's simple. Not burdensome and it includes every baptized member from the newest baptized baby to our oldest congregational member. Letting your children put their dollar in the giving box teaches them to be involved in supporting missions and spreading the Gospel. All it takes is \$1, 1 Member, every week to support missions in the North Dakota District. Each one of us is the body of Christ, and each one of us can accomplish so much with just a dollar a week. Help us spread the Gospel.

# FAITH CONNECTION-3 Words 4 You

You might look at this title and think I am piggy backing off of last month's article about love and Valentine's Day. Therefore, the 3 words that you might be guessing could be "I love you" or "Jesus loves you". You would be right in your guess, but the phrasing I had in mind is a bit different. "It is finished." In these three words, we hear that Jesus does love us.

You see, during this season of Lent we reflect on how Christ showed the ultimate form of love for us by perfectly living, dying, and rising again. We remember the ministry of Jesus, all the miracles he performed, the triumphant entry into Jerusalem, how the Pharisees plotted and schemed to get rid of him, the Last Supper and Judas betraying Jesus' in the Garden of Olives, Jesus' trial, being whipped, the insults and humiliation, the stripping of his clothes, the conversation with the other criminals on the cross, receiving sour wine on a sponge as his last drink, and ultimately, his death as he breathed his final words--"It is finished."

Jesus knew the long and painful road he had to take. He knew that every step He took with the disciples and his followers was one closer step to the cross. But He did not turn around, He did not stumble, He did not bail and leave the story unfinished. He did not write a different, less painful, or difficult ending. He knew how it had to be finished—With 3 words while hanging from a wooden cross. With arms stretched wide and hands and feet pierced with nails while wearing a crown of thorns. The horrible death of a criminal, for the perfect son of God. He took upon Himself every wrongdoing that all of humanity had ever thought, said, or done. "It is finished." The final sacrifice was made for us. What love is this, that the Savior of the world, that God himself would become human and die the death we all deserve. We are made right with God and are given new life. It is done. Death no longer has its grip on you. The evil foe is defeated, and he has no claim on your life. You are washed in the Blood of the Lamb and by his wounds, you are made new. This story does have a happy ending after all. We will be with Christ forever. "It is finished." For you.
