Pastor's Soundings in the Trumpeter...

Amen...whispered. Amen...mumbled. Amen...said. Amen...shouted! Amen...proclaimed! I have heard it different ways from different people at different times. Whatever way it is said, the basic meaning of Amen in Hebrew is "It is true!" or "It is truth!" It is the acclamation of agreeing with and confessing what is said and/or done. Many times in the translations of the New Testament, Amen is translated as, "Truly, Truly...." It really doesn't have the punch that "Amen" has or simply saying, "It is true," or "It is truth!", but that's what it means!

Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" John 14:6 (ESV). That's quite a bold statement, and very exclusive, emphasizing that Jesus is our only hope, our only salvation, our only redeemer, our only way to the Father.

That's so different from the way Pilate responds to Jesus after Jesus said, "I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." Pilate said to him, "What is truth?" John 18:37–38 (ESV). In our society there are so many for whom truth is relative, that is where you have your truth and I have my truth. Then how do we confess that there is truth? How do we profess the truth of Jesus Christ, the way, the truth, and the life!

What we have is what we speak and do. Go to your catechism and check out the meanings of the Lord's prayer and the three parts of the Creed and their meanings. Then notice how the meaning of the last petition and meanings of the three parts of the Creed end, "This is most certainly true!" That's the "Amen!"

I have spoken much of the Lord's Supper over the years, especially of what it means to go to this Holy Communion. We need to remember and be careful to give a clear testimony of the truth of Jesus Christ and the Word. When we go and receive communion at an altar of a congregation, we give our "Amen." By our Amen, we are saying that what is preached, taught, and practiced is true. Many of us will travel to see family, friends, and to vacation; we will find ourselves in different churches which are of different fellowships than our own Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). Why are they not in fellowship? Do we know? Can we give our Amen to what we don't know or disagree with? Of course not, nor should we.

Please note that there are those church bodies in fellowship with us around the world, where we can exchange pastors and commune in their congregations. Presently there are only two in North America, the Association of American Lutheran Churches (AALC) and Lutheran Church Canada (LCC). Their congregations are places with which we can confidently and boldly say our Amen.

So, when you go to another congregation check to see what the confession of faith is. At least in North America the simple identifier is the church body with which it is affiliated; is it LCMS, AALC, or LCC? If not, there are differences in confession which haven't been worked out yet. Certainly, there are there Christians there because the Word is there. Yet your "Amen" would be contradictory to them and to your membership at St. Andrew LCMS. Therefore, look for those congregations where you can joyfully give your bold "Amen."

Paraphrasing the meaning of the 7th Petition of the Lord's Prayer, "This means that I should be certain.... Amen, amen, means, yes, yes, it shall be so."

- General Fund Income for February was \$43,947. Three additional Lent services occurring in February helped considerably. Our 2024 annual budget is \$396,612, which means we have a monthly income goal of \$33,051. This money is used to cover normal operating expenses like payroll, utilities, missions, maintenance, etc. We exceeded our goal for February by \$10,896!
- Our YTD net results are at \$10,306. It's helpful to have "in the black" net revenue to start building a base to carry us through the summer months, when both attendance and giving typically decline.



WHAT'S ALL HAPPENING NOW?

For the past three years we have been promoting the Faithfully Forward Together Debt Reduction Campaign. This was a successful venture as we retired our Mortgage Loan, and the Shingle/Roof Repair Loan last year, paid off our Special Assessments in December and just recently retired our new Roof Loan in March!

YOUR RESPONSE HAS BEEN AMAZING!

FFT HAS CHANGED!

Since October, all donations to FFT have been allocated to a Restricted Offering account used just for debt reduction. We want to expand on this and now those donations be used for debt reduction **plus** repairs and improvements. Our goal is to be proactive and build this reserve, in hopes we do not have to take out future loans for some repairs. For many years we could not even think this way because of our debt load and financial situation. We constantly had year-end shortfalls. We are now in a better position to tackle some of these repairs needed to improve our Church home!

BUILDING A PLAN & PAYING FOR IT.

We knew of some looming repairs and at year-end placed about \$32,000 of our 2023 "In the Black" earnings in the Reserve Repairs & Maintenance Liability Account. This was a jump start to this fund to start planning for some of these repairs and improvements.

WHO IS FRANK THE FIXER?!

Frank the Fixer (aka our Board of Trustees) are putting together a list of deferred repairs and getting bids from vendors. Not all these repairs need to be done at once and some have more priority than others. We hope to chip away at them. The Trustees will be tasked with prioritizing as the need arises and the FFT Committee will be tasked with keeping our members informed of our donation progress and when projects are in the works and/or completed. Of course, other repairs could pop up that are not currently on the list. If that happens, the priority list will be revised.

Within the next few weeks, a direct mail brochure will be sent out to members listing the current deferred repairs, what they entail and an estimated cost. Our Church addition was completed nearly 20 years ago and some of those components need updating. We are hammering out these details with the Trustees right now to get this information ready for you. Just gathering the information and quotes is quite a task as most of these are large scale repairs:

- More Flat Roof Repairs
- Parsonage New Furnace & A/C System
- Parapet Shingles (perimeter of the addition)
- Residing and Repairs to the two Sheds
- GEO System items and many more!

We will track our FFT donations on an internal sign and provide updates in the bulletins and newsletters. The FFT Committee's priority has changed from Debt Reduction to Repairs and Improvements. We hope your "Over and Above" giving will continue to help us build our reserve! Be watching for Frank!
