(Boxes for both projects are located in the coat room. <u>Deadline is Sunday, November 24th.</u>)


#### JOYFUL RESPONSE-Stewardship & Thanksgiving

## A Thanksgiving Prayer



The Wind Symphony is the premier instrumental ensemble at Concordia University Chicago. This 48-member organization maintains an active performance schedule, having performed in schools, churches, and concert halls, in 43 states, Canada, Eastern Europe, and most recently, China. The group has a commitment to the finest traditional and contemporary, sacred and secular repertoire. To date, the Wind Symphony has recorded twelve CDs of sacred music.

#### POINSETTIAS FOR THE ALTAR



#### Moses and the Red Sea

Nine-year-old Joey was asked by his mother what he had learned in Sunday school.

#### Go and Bear Fruit

Just as branches of plants remain alive and bear fruit when connected to the vine, we are able to *live* generously because we are connected to Jesus. When we stay connected to Jesus by spending time in His Word and participating in the Sacraments, we will be fruitful. When we abide in Jesus, we minister to the needs of others as Jesus, the Vine, did during His life on earth.

We cannot *live generously* apart from Christ. Like the apple, which stays red and juicy for a long time after being picked, appears to be as healthy as when it hung on the tree, we, too, may look and act healthy, but, apart from a true connection with Christ, we will wrinkle up and rot as surely as an apple in a bowl on a table.

Some of us may try to maintain an outward connection with Him by attending church once in a while, but, even if we are regular in our church attendance and are actively involved in the work and mission of the church, without faith linking us with the Person of Christ, our busy-ness is fruitless. "Apart from Me," Christ said, "you can do nothing" (John 15:5), nor are our works even acceptable to God without faith in Him (Hebrews 11:6; Isaiah 64:6).

As believers, even if we don't have much in the way of material things, we have all we need in Jesus.
