GREETINGS IN THE NAME OF JESUS, OUR SAVIOR!

Some of you will remember that during the Second World War there was a very famous poster picturing our good own Uncle Sam. He was pictured wearing a red, white, and blue top hat. It was a poster used by our government and by the military to recruit men and women to serve their country. The man in the poster had a serious and stern look pointing his finger and saying, "I Want You!" I want you to enter the service of your country. Even though this enlistment could mean death, hundreds of thousands of men and women volunteered for service.



We are told by the Apostle Paul in Romans 12:1 that God "Wants you!" "I appeal to you brothers, by the mercies of God to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship." It may not sound as serious as laying down your life for your country, but it is! God is saying that He wants you to live and die for Him. He wants you to give your life for Him. God wants you completely. Everything that you are and have should belong to Him. God wants all of you.

In our daily routines, we tend not to take this notion of giving everything to God too seriously. However, God's Word clearly wants us to think more about how we can use our lives and our bodies in service to Him. The question to consider is, "Do we use our bodies in ways that honor God?" Let's consider our hands. Do we use them only to serve ourselves or do we use them in service to God. Do we use our eyes, ears, brains, mouths, etc. in service to God? God says every part of us is to be used as an act of worship. Everything we do can be an act of worship.

Do we think of the things that we do in our daily routines as being acts of service? We should consider that activities such as cooking meals, cutting the grass, changing diapers, going to school, or going to work can be acts of worship. We can also consider refusing to enter into gossip as an act of worship. When we reach out to help a neighbor, we should see that as an act of worship. God is seeking our total commitment.

In Romans 12:1, we are told, "by the mercies of God, to present our bodies as a living sacrifice." It is God's mercy and love that motivate us to offer our lives in commitment to Him. Because God loves, God enables us to give all that we are and have.

- this is true worship.*

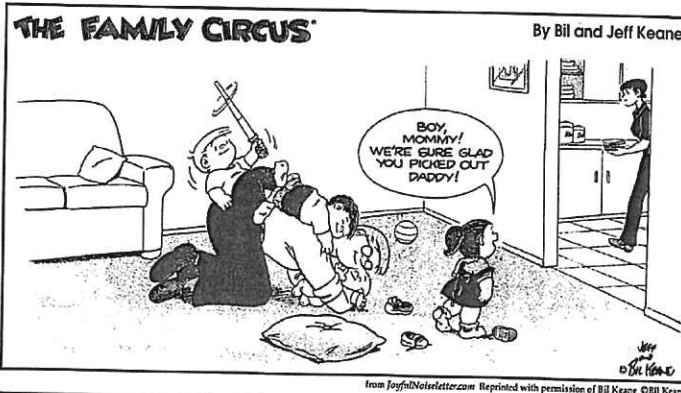

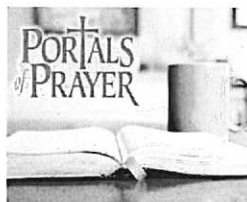
The band will also provide a couple hours of music after the service so don't forget your dancing shoes. Other plans at this time are a brat fry and a "bouncy house" for the kids.

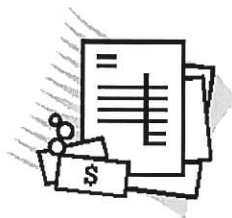

Living Generously

The purpose of this newsletter is to share God's Word so that our members will better understand who we are to be and what we are to do in the light of the Scriptures. It is our hope that this monthly publication will help you grow in your relationship with the Lord and as a Christian steward.



Consequences of Debt

Excessive debt can devastate a family's financial future, create tension and chaos in the family, break up a marriage, and cause health problems. When debt is out of control, larger amounts of money need to be diverted to pay the interest and principal to creditors. Family goals are put in jeopardy. Debt problems grow because the loan's compounding interest works against the borrower.

Money issues may monopolize a person's time, energy and conversation. Things more important than money are no longer of interest or discussed. Prayer and Bible study may be ignored. You can't do what God wants you to do with your money because you already owe it to others. You are no longer free to use your God-given resources

well. Your giving to God and others is reduced or stopped completely. Simply put, debt enslaves. Your debt is too high if it causes anxiety and problems in your home or with your relationship with God.

Debt can lead to a loss of a sense of reality. You live in a home that is owned in large part by a mortgage company or a bank. In your home, you have furniture owned by department stores which you pay for on an installment plan. In your garage is a car or cars owned by banks which you pay for on another plan. You may begin to believe that you are on top of the world and keep on borrowing.

Using debt can give you an illusion that you have more money than you actually have. In reality, you are putting

your future in hock to finance your indulgences. Having too much debt imperils a family's ability to save for the future and prepare for emergencies.



May God grant us all the discipline to control our spending and to not allow material things to become overly important.

When Do You Say, “I Have Enough”?

It has been said that today's necessities are yesterday's luxuries. For example, not long ago, it seemed that only a few people had cell phones; now almost everyone has one. Cell phones have become necessities rather than just luxuries. We could list dozens of "gadgets" that many of us now feel we cannot get along without.

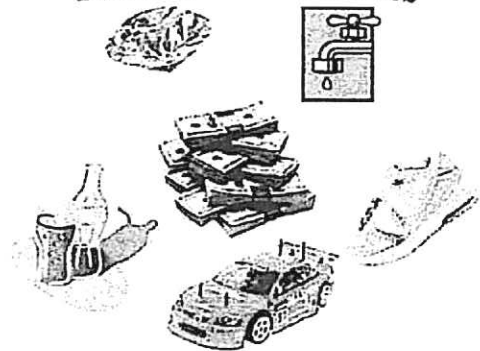
When we purchase things, do we think in terms of what is a necessity and what is a luxury? An equally important question is, "How much of what we own or want to buy is based on what our neighbors or friends have?" Jesus said, "*So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well*" (Matthew 6:31-33). Jesus is telling us that we should first seek a relationship with Him, and He will provide for us because He knows what we need. God promises to "*meet all your needs*" (Philippians 4:19); however, there is no promise to provide for our wants or luxuries. As Jesus said, "*Pagans run after all these things.*" In contrast, our attention and energy as Christians need to be focused on Jesus.

Studies have shown that, as we move up the economic ladder of success, we may stop feeling grateful for our improved circumstances and focus on the luxuries we still don't have. Rather than bringing us fulfillment, financial success can actually increase our desire for more luxuries. Then our three-bedroom home no longer gives us

the happiness we seek because we long for a four-bedroom home with a bathroom in each one.

It seems the desire for more things is like drinking salt water; the more salt water we drink the thirstier we become. When do we stop wanting more and say “enough is enough”? Because we are by nature selfish and greedy people, only the strength that comes from Jesus can separate us from our desire for more and more. As Paul wrote, “*I can do everything through Him Who gives me strength*” (Philippians 4:13).

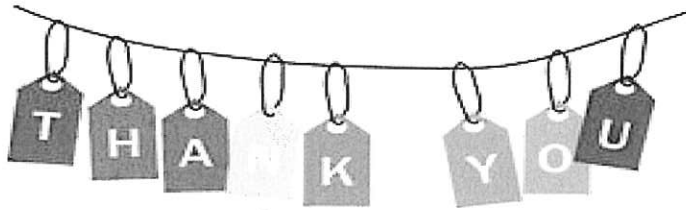

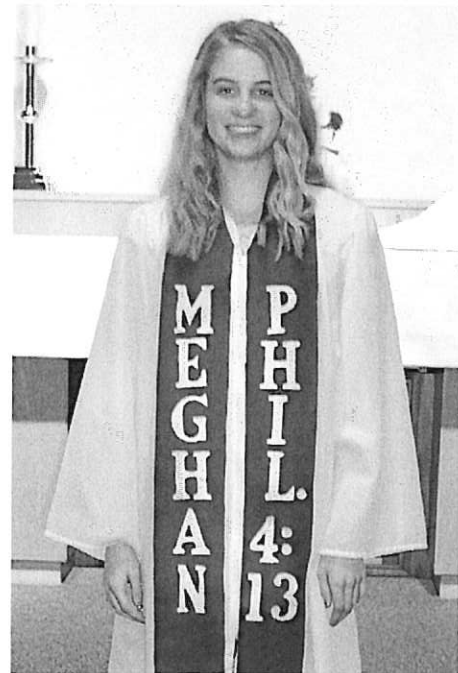

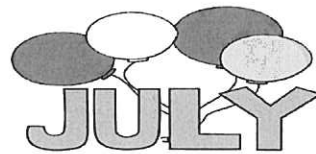
