## Jesus Is the Reason for the Season

It's December and preparations Christmas are underway. Unfortunately, for some, this is a period of great stress, inadequate sleep, and too much busyness. Is this what Advent is all about? Jesus said. "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with Me" (Revelation 3:20). pleasant request! Shut the door of the world. Open the door of your heart to Jesus' knocking. Enjoy fellowship with Jesus and receive His wonderful gifts!

#### The Word Became Flesh

Isn't it amazing to think that "The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us" (John 1:14)? Who are we that the Word

Himself should come to this squalid world to live among us? We are those He loves – loves so much that He would leave Heaven, would abase Himself, would suffer for us, would die for our sin, would rise so that we, too, can rise. We are those who, in response to this great love, serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness.

#### His Ways Are Not Our Ways

Here we are, ready to celebrate the birth of Christ – a major event, even for those who don't believe in Him. Today this celebration is heralded back in October, or at least November, by merchants filling their shelves with enticing gifts, decorations, cards, and all the trappings of Christmas.



How different from the first Christmas! Mary and Joseph settled down in an inn. There were no photographers waiting outside to snap the first picture of the new king. No one knew what was happening! No one, that is, except for the parents and the host of Heaven who made the announcement. But to whom was this announcement made? To the powerful who would speed through the towns and villages,

spreading the news? No, to shepherds who were outcasts, hired hands who were so low on the social scale that they weren't even allowed to give testimony in a court of law. They weren't even allowed to come into the Temple.

Yet these were the ones chosen by God to tell the good news. These wretched creatures saw the angels with "...the glory of the Lord [shining] around them..." They heard the message the angels brought: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord.... You will find a baby...lying in a manger" (Luke 2:9,10). They saw, they listened, and then they went to see for themselves. After receiving the Good News, they spread it. "When they had seen Him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them" (Luke 2:17-18).

If lowly shepherds could tell the story, can't we as well? "All who heard it were amazed," Luke writes, but he doesn't say all believed. All we're asked to do is tell the story. How could fear, uncertainty, or apathy hold us back? This is the biggest news mankind has ever received! As stewards of the Gospel, we have no choice but to follow the example of the shepherds and "spread the word concerning what has been told [us] about this child."

# Giving Jesus our Hearts

The wise men brought Jesus gifts, but, before presenting their gifts, they first gave Him honor through giving of themselves. Matthew 2:10-11 says, "When they saw the star they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with His mother

Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped Him. Then they opened their treasures and presented Him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh." Before we give God our treasures, we must first give Him our hearts. This is the meaning of stewardship. God wants our praise and adoration.



### Prayer for Christmas Day:

Dear Heavenly Father, today all of Christendom sings with jubilation, "Joy to the world, the Lord is come!" incomprehensible the love You have for us that would cause You to send Your only Son to earth to bring us joy. Yet we confess that we often are mired in discouragement and grief. While looking at our present circumstances, we forget that You have gone before us on the roads we travel and that You are with us to take us through all the difficult passages of life. Suffering with our various losses, we forget that You, in the Person of Your beloved Son, have come and are still with us today to bring us abundant joy. Forgive us for our lack of trust in You. Help us to keep in our hearts every day the joy of this holy day and to share that joy with all we meet. Through Christ we pray. Amen.



Our midweek Advent series focuses on the ways in which God is with us through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Each week will focus on a different word picture of the coming Christ found in the poetic and prophetic words of Isaiah. Services will reveal how Christ continues be present with us even now. The theme verse for the entire series is: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel (which means, God with us)" (Matthew 1:23).

- Dec. 5: Our Potter (Isaiah 64:8): God is with us as our Potter, who shapes according to his will.
- **Dec. 12:** Our Shepherd (Isaiah 40:11): God is with us as our Shepherd, who carries us close to his heart.
- **Dec. 19:** Our Living Branch (Isaiah 11:1): God is with us as our Living Branch, who died and rose to give us eternal life.
- Dec. 23: Our Guide (Isaiah 2:3): God is with us as our Guide, who leads us according to his Word.
