We are encouraged to put aside some money into savings. We've been taught the 10-10-80 principle of tithing the first ten percent, saving the second, and living on the remaining 80, so we see that, next to giving God our first and best, saving is of utmost importance. The Apostle Paul admonished, "As for the rich in this present age, charge them not be to haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, Who richly provides us with everything to enjoy" (1 Timothy 6:17). Rather, he added, "They are to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share..." (verse 18). That would be enough for us: to know God's will and to obey it. Nevertheless, Paul tells us there is a blessing involved: "...thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life" (verse 19).
