

Living Generously

The purpose of this newsletter is to share God's Word so that our members will better understand who we are to be and what we are to do in the light of the Scriptures. It is our hope that this monthly publication will help you grow in your relationship with the Lord and as a Christian steward.


Receiving God's Unconditional Love

Almost daily we use the word "love." If you have a spouse or children, you tell them that you love them. When you enjoy a meal, you may say, "I loved my dinner." We often say that we loved a movie. The word love has different meanings, among them affection and desire. We often go beyond just telling our loved ones of our love. We express that love by spending billions of dollars each vear on birthdays, anniversaries, or Valentine's Days buying cards, flowers, and chocolates.

God's love is evident throughout the Old and New Testaments. The 13th chapter of First Corinthians is referred to as the Bible's love chapter. This passage is not talking about loving a meal or a TV program; it is talking about Christian love. The Apostle Paul, who wrote the letter to the Corinthians, exalts love as the supreme gift. beginning verses, he tells the Corinthians (and us) that love is more important than prophesying, knowledge. faith. generosity. In verses four through eight, he presents Christian love in a personal way: "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not

irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends."

As mentioned above, the word love is used to mean different things. For us as Christians the inspirational meaning of love is found in what is perhaps the most widely known Scripture verse, John 3:16. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." Love in this sense is sacrificial. It expresses a commitment of love so profound that God was willing to let His Son suffer and die on the cross because of His unconditional love for us.



special and unique because we are undeserving of His love. Paul tells us, "For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly... God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6-8). When the time was right, God rescued us from our sins and death.

A Noble Task

This third chapter of 1Timothy is full of instructions to God's people about the qualifications necessary for overseers and deacons. While you may not hold such a title, as a leader in your congregation you would do well to study these instructions and ask God's help in attaining the standards He sets for church leaders.

All of God's people should be "above reproach" (1 Timothy 3:2). The Apostle Peter writes that we should "[have] a good conscience, so that, when [we] are slandered, those who revile [our] good behavior in Christ may be put to shame" (1 Peter 3:16). This is even more true for church leaders, for your brothers and sisters in Christ are watching your behavior and are encouraged or discouraged by it. "And [Jesus] said to His disciples, "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come!" (Luke 17:1).

You are a steward of the life that God has given you. He asks you to live it according to His purpose for His glory and for the edification of His Body, the Church. How important it is to be strengthened in faith through Word and Sacrament in order that we might take up the work God has left for us to do until His Son's return! May each of us avail ourselves of the gifts He so graciously gives that we might be equipped for His service.

Faithful Stewards

God, Who created us, calls us to be faithful stewards of our lives and the gifts He entrusts to us. Through faith, we understand that who we are and what we have belong to Him. We are managers, not owners. As God's stewards, we live our lives in ways

that express our gratitude for who He is and what He has done for us.

We say a thank-you to God when we faithfully manage our time, our abilities, and our money. Our faithful stewardship is seen in our deeds and actions. Through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, we become faithful stewards who respond willingly and joyfully to God's love for us, actually living out the definition of stewardship: the free and joyous activity of managing all that we have for the Lord. Our thankfulness and devotion to Him are illustrated by the lifestyles that we lead as we practice faithful stewardship through our faithful service to Him.

Be Good Steward

Devotion can be expressed at every level and in every activity of life. As Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "So, whether you eat or drink; or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (1 Corinthians 10:31). As God's stewards, we can rejoice in knowing that even our most mundane tasks can be dedicated to Him.

In the Parable of the Talents, the master commended two of the servants for the wise management of the gifts given to them. In the same way, our heavenly Father will tell us "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:23) when we faithfully manage our lives and gifts for Him.

- Think especially of persons who are undergoing personal life stresses of some kind.
