- P Hear the good news! Jesus walked to places of rejection, suffering, torment, and death—for you. Jesus was determined to go to Gethsemane, Gabbatha, and Golgotha—for you. That's why Jesus forgives you completely and loves you eternally. Faithful Lord, with me abide!

Old Testament Reading

Exodus 12:1–14

¹The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, ²"This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. ³Tell all the congregation of Israel that

on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers' houses, a lamb for a household. ⁴And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb. ⁵Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, ⁶and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight.

7"Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. ⁸They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it. ⁹Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted, its head with its legs and its inner parts. ¹⁰And you shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. ¹¹In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the LORD's Passover. ¹²For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. ¹³The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.

¹⁴"This day shall be for you a memorial day, and you shall keep it as a feast to the LORD; throughout your generations, as a statute forever, you shall keep it as a feast."

+ STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR +

The stripping of the altar is an ancient feature of Maundy Thursday, symbolic of the humiliation of Jesus at the soldier's hands. Psalm 22 rehearses that and other themes of the Passion.

- **P** My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?
- Why are you so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning?
- P O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer, and by night, but I find no rest.

611 Chief of Sinners Though I Be

LSB 611

- 1 Chief of sinners though I be, Jesus shed His blood for me, Died that I might live on high, Lives that I might never die. As the branch is to the vine, I am His, and He is mine.
- P Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
- In you our fathers trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- P To you they cried and were rescued; in you they trusted and were not put to shame.
- Oh, the height of Jesus' love, Higher than the heav'ns above, Deeper than the depths of sea, Lasting as eternity!

 Love that found me—wondrous thought! Found me when I sought Him not.
- P But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people.
- All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads;
- P "He trusts in the Lord; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, for he delights in him!"
- Yet you are he who took me from the womb; you made me trust you at my mother's breasts.
- P On you was I cast from my birth, and from my mother's womb you have been my God.

- 3 Only Jesus can impart Balm to heal the wounded heart, Peace that flows from sin forgiv'n, Joy that lifts the soul to heav'n, Faith and hope to walk with God In the way that Enoch trod.
- P Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.
- Many bulls encompass me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me;
- P they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.
- I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;
- P my strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.
- For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet—
- **P** I can count all my bones—they stare and gloat over me;
- C they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots.
- 4 Chief of sinners though I be, Christ is all in all to me; All my wants to Him are known, All my sorrows are His own. He sustains the hidden life Safe with Him from earthly strife.
- P But you, O Lord, do not be far off! O you my help, come quickly to my aid!
- Deliver my soul from the sword, my precious life from the power of the dog!
- P Save me from the mouth of the lion! You have rescued me from the horns of the wild oxen!
- I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:
- P You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him, and stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel!
- For he has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted, and he has not hidden his face from him, but has heard, when he cried to him.

- O my Savior, help afford By Your Spirit and Your Word! When my wayward heart would stray, Keep me in the narrow way; Grace in time of need supply While I live and when I die.
- P From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will perform before those who fear him.
- The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord! May your hearts live forever!
- P All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations shall worship before you.
- **C** For kingship belongs to the Lord, and he rules over the nations.
- P All the prosperous of the earth eat and worship; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, even the one who could not keep himself alive.
- **C** Posterity shall serve him; it shall be told of the Lord to the coming generation;
- P they shall come and proclaim his righteousness to a people yet unborn, that he has done it.
