Living Generously

The purpose of this newsletter is to share God's Word so that our members will better understand who we are to be and what we are to do in the light of the Scriptures. It is our hope that this monthly publication will help you grow in your relationship with the Lord and as a Christian steward.

The Bible Is a Love Story

God's love flows out of His nature and His character. The Apostle John tells us "God is love" (1 John 4:8). All of God's actions are loving, even when we cannot perceive them to be so. Not only are His actions loving, but all He withholds from us or refrains from doing in our lives is also loving. We deserve God's wrath but instead we get His love. His love rescues us from our sinful and rebellious state. No matter who we are or what we've done, God's love seeks us. There is no sin that is too much for God to handle. He demonstrated His amazing love for us when He sent His Son, Jesus, to live among us and to suffer and die on the cross. Jesus took upon Himself all of our past and Jesus' willingness to be future sins. mocked, to suffer, and to experience the most brutal type of death is the most significant act of love in the history of the world and in each of our lives. The path to God's love is to believe that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6). Loving and trusting in Jesus gives us an abundant life today and life forever with Him in heaven.

In his book, A Martyr's Faith in a Faithless World, Rev. Bryan Wolfmueller writes,

"The Bible is a love story. God is love. You are the beloved. This is astonishing when we consider how unlovely and how

unlovable we are." God saw our depravity and sin and that is why He sent His Son—so we could receive God's love. God's love never changes, and we have the joy of receiving more and more of His love on a daily basis.



God has put us on earth to do two things. We are to first love God and then love our neighbors. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-40). Loving God and others is what matters most in life. There is nothing more insisted upon in the Bible than love. The Apostle John tells us, "We love because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19). All love comes from God, and we are able to love because we have received His love through Jesus.

Four Types of Love

In scripture, love is communicated through four Greek words: Philia, Storge

(pronounced STOR-jay), Eros, and Agape. These different types of love are characterized by brotherly love, family love, romantic love, and God's divine love.

- Philia love (friendship love) is the type of intimate love in the Bible that most Christians practice toward each other. There is emotional warmth and tender affection toward a friend or family member. It involves closeness, bonding, and mutual sharing in a relationship. It is companionship or brotherly love. This friendship was seen between Jonathan and David.
- Storge love (empathy love) refers to family love. Love for others because you have something in common. Love comes from common circumstances, common beliefs, common values, or common blood. The love that exists between parents and children, and brothers and sisters. It was the love that Mary and Martha had for their brother Lazarus.
- Eros love (romantic love) refers to sensual or romantic love. It refers to sexual desire. The intimate love shared between a married man and woman. It is the most selfish love. It can be very intoxicating. It was the love that David had for Bathsheba.
- Agape love (unconditional God love) is the highest of the four types of love in the Bible. This term defines God's immeasurable, incomparable love for mankind. It is the divine love that comes from God. Agape love is perfect and unconditional. John 3:16 tells us: "For God so [agaped] the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in

Him should not perish but have eternal life."

God Changes our Hearts

Our relationships with fellow believers are not dependent upon external things but develop because of Jesus' love for us and our love for Him. In Acts 2:44-46 we find a special relationship among believers. "And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need." Among these fellow believers, there was a willingness to share things. They looked out for each other both physically and spiritually. Equality existed because



those in need received from those who had the ability to share. This love for others comes from hearts changed by God.

Telling Others about Jesus

In order to share the Gospel with others, are we willing to forego some personal discomfort? Are we willing to risk our reputations by associating with those clearly identified as godless people? One way to become more intentional about evangelism and telling others about Jesus is to make a list of some people needing to hear the Good News. Include acquaintances with whom you could start building relationships in order to share your love for Jesus with them. With the help of the Holy Spirit, you can help them see how much God loves them, that He sent His Son to die for them, and that they can live forever with Him.


