



Living Generously

The purpose of this newsletter is to share God's Word so that our members will better understand who we are to be and what we are to do in the light of the Scriptures. It is our hope that this monthly publication will help you grow in your relationship with the Lord and as a Christian steward.

Doing God's Perfect Will

In Romans 12:1 the Apostle Paul tells us "... to offer [our] bodies as living sacrifices..."Christ sacrificed Himself for our sins, but, as He rose from the dead, so we Christians shall never die. We are living sacrifices who serve others in response to the grace that has been shown to us. We seek opportunities to be useful and to be God's representatives here on earth. In 2 Corinthians 5:20, Paul calls us "Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us." We do not have to have extraordinary abilities or spheres of influence, because we know that God is not limited by our flaws or by circumstances. We just need to make ourselves available, because God has chosen to make His appeal through us. By looking at Christian stewards, others see what Christ is like.



Christ spent His years of ministry on earth as a servant. People listened to Him because they saw that His words were backed up by His deeds. God asks that we be faithful in service and promises that, through His Word, He will equip us "for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17). God has created and redeemed us, and, through Word and Sacrament, His Holy Spirit continues His work of sanctification in us. The more aware we are of God's great love and mercy, the more we desire to serve Him.

A Tender Story

An eye witness account from New York City, on a cold day in December, some years ago: A little boy, about 10-years-old, was standing before a shoe store on the roadway, barefooted, peering through the window, and shivering with cold.

A lady approached the young boy and said, "My, but you're in such deep thought staring in that window!"

"I was asking God to give me a pair of shoes," was the boy's reply.

The lady took him by the hand, went into the store, and asked the clerk to get half a dozen pairs of socks for the boy. She then asked if he could give her a basin of water and a towel. He quickly brought them to her.

She took the little fellow to the back part of the store and, removing her gloves, knelt down, washed his little feet, and dried them with the towel.

By this time the clerk had returned with the socks. Placing a pair upon the boy's feet, she purchased him a pair of shoes.

She wrapped up the remaining pairs of socks and gave them to him. She patted him on

the head and said, "No doubt, you will be more comfortable now."

As she turned to go, the astonished kid caught her by the hand, and looking up into her face, with tears in his eyes, asked her. "Are you God's wife?"

Make Your Choice

Joshua had faithfully served the nation Israel after the death of Moses. He was faithful both to his God and to his people. At the end of his life, as the nation is taking its place in the Promised Land, he offers them a choice: "Now fear the Lord and serve Him with all faithfulness . . . But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served . . . or the gods of the Amorites . . . But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:14-15).



As Christian stewards, we, too, have a choice to make. Maybe we're not tempted to serve the gods of the Amorites, but there is another god that vies for our worship: the god of wealth. That god promises that, if we put our trust in him, he will make us powerful, envied by others, satisfied by all the possessions he can obtain for us, and bring us status and prestige among our peers. This god, of course, is just as false as the idol the Amorites worshiped. He may

bring temporary good fortune, but we find no lasting value, only disappointment and disillusionment, in following him.

The Israelites' answer to Joshua was, "We will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:21). As the Israelites began their new life in the Promised Land, let us "serve the Lord" as He has enabled us to do.



April 24, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 10:05AM by President Gary Koerth.

- Gary Streck made a motion to accept the membership action. Second by Gary Lemke. MC.

Treasurer's Report

- At the end of March, we were \$754.82 in the red.
- At the end of January, we started out at \$8775.49 in the red.
- If this continues, we should be in the black by the end of April. Looking to make an additional payment to the loan. Recent brat fry and fish fry proceeds are allowing the opportunity for additional payment to the loan. The challenge to members continues and we each need to keep up with monetary and spiritual support.
- Noted there has been an increased excitement in church with the reintroduction of Lenten meals.
- \$500 will be given to Susan Wittmann from the Earl and Millie Behnke fund to offset costs of going to the youth convention. Hopefully this experience will spark ideas for the future of St. Bart's youth.
- Debbie Kamps will continue to provide monthly reports of our financials in newsletters/in person discussions.
- Gary Koerth requested that the treasurer's report be filed for audit.

Pastor Krueger has been working/training with Lois Stache, church secretary, in regard to the powerpoint.
 She will be our interim tech person until our new Pastor is installed/ordained. Please commend her if you see her!

- Hoping for a good turnout 4/27/2022 for our call party.
- Reminder that only two elders are currently serving. Thank you to Tanner Behnke who has been
 volunteering for communion assistant. He reminds voters that he does not attend meetings or assist with
 any decision making.

Stewardship/Evangelism

- Next monthly meeting is 5/4/2022
- Thank you to all who participated in the Lenten suppers. Noted increased attendance as we progressed through the Lenten season along with great fellowship.
- Brat Fry at St. Vincent Hilbert on 4/8/2022-thank you to all who worked/ate. \$820 as raised and given to debt retirement.
- New member fellowship-welcomes Dallas and Sharon Wenzel;
- Jess Wendling.
- Brillionfest. We need volunteers to chair the float committee. This is the weekend of June 10, 2022.
 Theme is a thank you to Pastor Krueger. Coincidentally, this weekend is Pastor's last weekend in the pulpit. We have a trailer to use-the Wittmann's, and a church pew from the Koerth's available to us. We need creative ideas!

Trustees

- The process of converting our lights to LED has been completed. No real difference noted in illumination, maybe a bit brighter.
- Thrivent gift cards are needed! These would be applied to the parsonage upgrades of paint and supplies. We are looking at full interior painting and related supplies, replacing the toilet and stretching the carpets. A walk through will be done early May, 2022. Please contact Dave Kamps regarding Thrivent cards or help with parsonage projects. Plan on work parties early May 2022.
- There will be a separation of church mail from parsonage mail. Currently Pastor Krueger gets everything and distributes. Church and parsonage will each have their own mail box.
- Entry bell for church through the vestibule: the wireless is not working. Will install a wired doorbell.
 Expect the doors to church to be locked during the week when Lois is there alone once this is completed.
- The Organ circuit board has been replaced and functioning. We are currently awaiting a second quote for the organ "blower".
- We are receiving quotes for the parking lot. It will not be resealed this year-only crack filling and repainting of the lines due to expense of organ repair.
- Looking at an outside lawn service for our approximate 2.5 acres of property. This was always graciously taken care of in the past by Pastor and Kris. The cost of a one time application for weed and feed alone for this amount is approximately \$718. Competitive quotes are currently coming in to provide this service 4 times/year at around \$814.
- There will be an outdoor work day in May, date to be determined.
- The second boiler was a full repair and both boilers are working at status quo. We again have a primary and secondary boiler.

Pastor's Report

- Confirmation is May 1, 2022 this year. We have 2 confirmands.
- Jim Wendling won the March Madness bracket challenge.

 Military Bible Sticks. Who won is yet to be determined! We did have donations come through on Easter morning. 5 area churches participated.

Unfinished Business

- Constitution/Bylaws. Job descriptions are still pending. Will postpone this vote of job descriptions until the October 2022 voter's meeting.
- Constitution and Bylaws Revisions

Amendments:

- 12.1 Amendments to this constitution(except 2.0, 6.0 and 11.0) may be adopted at a regular or special meeting of the Voters' Assembly, provided:
 - 1. 12.11 That they do not conflict with the provisions laid down in Article II or with any section of any other article that pertains to scriptural doctrine or practice
 - 12.12 That the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing at a previous meeting of the Voters' Assembly
 - 12.13 The revised constitution shall, as a condition of continued membership in good standing of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, must be submitted to the president of the district for review by the district constitution committee and favorable action by the district's board of directors before being adopted by the congregation.

• Bylaw Revisions:

Meetings:

- 4.1 Regular meeting of the Voters' Assembly shall be held quarterly unless no business needs to be conducted. Meetings will be held in person. Voting members who cannot attend in person may participate virtually. Under certain circumstances, identified by the church council, meetings may be held virtually.
- 4.2 The regular meeting of the Voters' Assembly during the first quarter shall be designated as the annual meeting.
- 4.3 Regular meetings of the Voters' Assembly shall be announced by word or in the bulletin in all church services on the preceding two Sundays. Whenever a meeting has thus been announced and convened, all voting members present shall constitute a quorum except for when the following subjects will be voted on, which would then require a quorum of twenty people. If a quorum is not met, another meeting will be scheduled where all members in attendance will constitute the quorum.
 - 1. Amending the constitution/bylaws
 - 2. Buying or selling property
 - 3. Disbanding of the congregation
- 4.4 Special meetings of the Voters' Assembly may be called by the Church Council, Board of Elders, or the pastor with the approval of the president, or ten(10) voting members. Announcements of special meetings shall be made in the services of the two previous Sundays or in the services of the previous Sunday when accompanied by notification by mail, email, text or some other electronic means. The purpose of all special meetings must be included in the announcements.
- 4.6 Board meetings may be held either in person or virtually.

Amendments

- These bylaws may be amended in a properly convened meeting of the voters' assembly.
 - Amendments shall be adopted by a majority of all votes cast, provided the proposed change
 has been announced in a previous meeting or has been submitted in writing at least two
 weeks prior to the meeting to all voting members.
 - The revised bylaws shall, as a condition of continued membership in good standing of the

 Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, must be submitted to the president of the district for review by the district constitution committee and favorable action by the district board of directors before being adapted by the congregation.

• Election of Congregational Officers

 7.0 The nominating committee for each year shall consist of the vice president and a junior member of each of the Boards.

• Terms of Officers

- 8.2 The term of the President and Vice President will be 2 year terms being duly elected on
 alternating years eligible, for not more than 2 consecutive terms. The nature of the duties of this
 board requires that only men noted for their Christian knowledge, zeal, and experience in the
 spiritual work of the Kingdom of Christ shall be elected.
- 8.3 The term of office of all other officers who do not serve on boards shall be for one year, eligible for continuous re election.
- 8.4 Board members may hold the same office for two full terms of two or three years as set forth
 for each board. After one year of being out of office, this person shall again be eligible to hold
 this same office.

Per President Gary Koerth the above Constitution and Bylaw Revisions have been previously submitted and approved by the district president and the district constitution committee.

Motion made by Faith Sonnabend to accept the Constitution and Bylaw Revisions as presented at the January 30, 2022 and April 24, 2022 meetings and as typed as above. Seconded by Lori Fels. Motion made, seconded and carried.

Motion was made to reappoint Tanner Behnke for another term as Elder by Lori Fels. Tanner Behnke present at meeting and accepting of position. This is seconded by David Sonnabend. Motion made, seconded and carried.

Lon Fels stated once the Pastor is chosen, there are 2 things that need to happen before he can start serving as our Pastor-ordination-which can be done at his home church or the church of his choosing, and

-installation-which is done at the church he receives the call from.

These services may be combined on the same day here at St. Bart's.
