Greetings in Christ.

It is with great excitement and joy that I now write this, my first newsletter to you, the saints of St. Bartholomew's Lutheran church! But it is also with reverence, and a bit of fear, that I now take on the role of your pastor, a new pastor in a long line of those who have served here for the last 150 odd years. But it is more than the pastors who have served at St. Bartholomew's that I would like you to consider this month, but it is the long succession of pastors that have served throughout God's church going all the way back to the apostles, one of whom we will be celebrating this month, and that is St. Bartholomew himself!

The church has traditionally held what is called "feast days," and this month, on the 24th, the church celebrates the life of St. Bartholomew, the apostle after whom our church is named. St. Bartholomew, after the ascension of Jesus, is said to have traveled to the east and served as evangelist and missionary to Ethiopia and modern Iran. He served faithfully as the other apostles in his work of spreading the gospel, and also died as all the other apostles, with the exception of John, at the hands of those he was sent by God to serve. In the year 69 St. Bartholomew was beaten and beheaded, giving his life for the gospel and his Lord. He served faithfully and held close to his heart the words of Psalm 116:15, "Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his saints."

And so it is now that we, who bear the name of Christ, our suffering Lord, but also as a church who bear the name of His servant Bartholomew, ought to pray for the same boldness of our Lord which was also found in His servants the apostles. Boldness of life. Boldness of proclamation. And, yes, even boldness of death. For in him who raises the dead, there is no death. Praise be to our God who makes such sweet promises unto us! Amen




