Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ!

Last year, we considered the lives of the saints, and in particular the martyrs celebrated each month, who gave their lives to Christ in the manner of Paul: "But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life." (1 Tim 1:16) Each of the martyrs who came before serve us still today as images or examples of the work of God in their lives, the putting to death of the sinful flesh and the raising up again with Christ in glory. They serve us as constant reminders of what it looks like to deny ourselves, take up our crosses, and follow Him (Matt 16:24), and finally, to thank God for the great patience he has shown and continues to show us when we are found unwilling to do what he has called us to do.

But we've been given other examples to follow as well. One of the chief examples of the Christian life is found in the liturgy which we experience each week. The liturgy is that thing through which we are, in a way, "transformed" as Paul says, "by the renewal of your mind." (Romans 12:2) That is, Paul wants us to unlearn the ways of this world around us ("Do not be conformed to this world") and to learn the ways of God. This renewal and transformation has been done through the liturgy well before our time, we could make the argument (as Lutherans often have), that it began all the way back in the first book of the Bible, Genesis. There we see altars built continuously and people "calling on the name of the Lord."

Throughout this next year we will consider the liturgy which we speak and sing through together each week, its history, reason for being, and how it helps us today, to get a better appreciation for why the church has worshiped this way, almost since its inception, and what great benefits it brings us! Until then, Christ's blessings be on you all,


Pastor Gone on Vacation




