- \* Hosted a New Member Reception on April 26 for Whitney Krueger and Diane Zickert, and served refreshments following the service.
- \* Changed the outdoor church sign with different sayings on a monthly basis as well as adding any special events or upcoming special services.
- \* Entered a float in the Brillion Fest light parade on June 12. Our theme was "Wise Men Still Seek Him." We placed one of our outdoor nativity camels on the float along with a lite-up sign and cross. Post-It note pads and flyswatters with our church information on were passed out along the parade route. We received \$250 from the Thrivent Action Team program to go toward expenses with the float.

- \* Alice Koerth volunteered to coordinate all special meals that we have throughout the year.
- \* "Leading Generously" series was held in October and November. A hand-out of a money pouch was given to families as a reminder to lead generously by giving from our hearts.
- \* Faith Sonnabend was selected to write up articles for the Brillion News whenever we have special events at our church, along with Rick Riemer who will be our official photographer. Charity Plate is

- also putting these special events on Facebook for us.
- \* We hosted Dairy Queen Family Fun Night on November 2. Our members supported this event by coming out to eat and to volunteer their time helping. Our proceeds from this event were \$239.86.
- \* We changed our Adopt-A-Tot program by replacing it with Adopt-A-Family. The congregation donated items for a family in need in our area that was given to them at Christmas time. Thrivent also contributed \$250 through their "Care Abounds" program.
- \* Thank-you letters were sent to those people who use Thrivent Choice Dollars.
- \* The GrassCutters bluegrass group performed at our November 4 & 8 services. We served refreshments following both of these services.
- \* We are looking for volunteers to sign up to be a greeter. A sign-up sheet was placed on the bulletin board so that we can make up a schedule for next year.
