GREETINGS IN THE NAME OF JESUS, OUR SAVIOR!

We like winning! How did you feel the last time you won at playing cards, a board game, a tennis match, or a round of golf? Winning gives us great joy. Whether the winning prize is money, ribbons, trophies, or just an "attaboy" or "attagirl," we work harder, and we give it our maximum effort to earn the prize.

In the 9th chapter of 1 Corinthians, the Apostle Paul refers to the contest of running. To be the fastest runner, runners go through disciplined training to make themselves faster so they can cross the finish line first and win the prize. 1 Corinthians 9:24-25 reads, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable." The Apostle Paul refers to a much more important event than runners running a race to win a prize that won't last. He refers to a race that involves life and death. The special prize that Paul refers to in these verses is the prize of eternal life. The prize is a life with Jesus forever!

Although Paul contrasted the two different prizes, he does refer to the similarities in the effort needed to run both races. Runners train diligently for their races through "strict training." The Christian disciplines himself, making his body his "slave," all "for the sake of the Gospel, that [he] may share with them in its blessings" (1 Cor. 9:23). We are filled and refreshed as we spend time in God's Word, worship regularly, pray often, and receive His Sacraments. As Christians, we know we can be faithful in what we do because God is within us, and He strengthens us. He entrusts us with time, talent, and money to be His instruments of service to others. God calls us to be faithful in our service to Him through serving others. "So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith" (Gal. 6:10).

As God's people, we need to keep our focus on the all-important prize and, with God's help, not to allow temporary successes in this life interfere with the goal of receiving the most wonderful prize which is eternal life with Him. As the Apostle Paul told the church in Corinth, "Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift!" (2 Cor. 9:15).



Don't forget God's inexpressible gift of Word and Sacrament during the summer months. You may take a vacation but God doesn't and neither does the devil! Worship is our vacation from the stress and strain of the week – a time of rest and renewal for our souls.

Living Generously

The purpose of this newsletter is to share God's Word so that our members will better understand who we are to be and what we are to do in the light of the Scriptures. It is our hope that this monthly publication will help you grow in your relationship with the Lord and as a Christian steward.

A Stewardship Thought

When things start possessing us, God is moved to the periphery, and things we want to possess prohibit our spiritual growth. Matthew 6:21 says, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." How distressing it is to find that the things we earnestly pursued and believed we needed for our welfare, once attained, turned out to be the cause of growing emptiness.

Testing your Knowledge of Scripture

Can you identify what parable the following person represents?



If you said the Parable of the Ten Virgins (Matthew 25:1-13), you were right. Jesus told a story of ten virgins who, according to the wedding customs of the day, prepared themselves for the arrival of the bridegroom. The ten girls were to accompany the bride with their lamps to the house of the bridegroom's parents where the wedding

would be held. Five of the virgins failed to plan for the possibility that the bridegroom would be delayed and didn't bring extra oil for their lamps. On the other hand, the five wise virgins were prepared with extra oil and were ready when the bridegroom arrived to take them to the celebration.

In the parable, the bridegroom is Jesus. In the coming of the bridegroom, Jesus is talking about His own return. The five foolish virgins are not referred to as being guilty of evil but of unfaithfulness in being prepared for His coming. The oil, which represents their faith, was missing. The wise girls are the faithful people who nurture God's gift of faith through Word and Sacrament.

Through the reading and studying of God's Word and through the participation in the Lord's Supper, we also prepare our minds and hearts for faithful stewardship.

The one dollar bill said, "You know, same old stuff—church, church, church"



Living a Fruitful Life

"Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in Me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing" (John 15:4-5).

Fruit characterizes the life of the Christian steward. It is interesting to note that, in the passage above, Jesus did not say, "You should bear fruit." He stated that, when we abide in Him, it follows naturally that we will bear fruit.



Paul explained to the Galatians what that fruit is: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, patience. kindness, goodness. пеасе. gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control." "If we live by the Spirit," Paul exhorted, "let us also walk by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another" (Galatians 5:25-26). As children of God, we have this fruit because His Spirit lives in us. We do not bear fruit as a result of our own efforts, but we do cease to bear fruit when we give in to our sinful natures, becoming, in Paul's words, "conceited, provoking one another. and envying one another."

Just as fruit needs light for its growth and maturation, so do Christians need to have their lives illumined by Christ. Then they are able to produce spiritual fruit and shed that light on the world around them. Ephesians 5:11 says, "Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness." God calls us to "walk as children of light (for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true), and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord" (verse 8).



We discover God's will through His word and through prayer. As Paul prayed for the Colossians, we, too, can ask God that we may be "filled with the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding so as to walk in manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to Him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God" (Colossians 1:9-10).

God has plans and uses for our lives. When we abide in Christ, we will be fruitful. We will discover and follow His plan, and we will use the gifts He has given us in ministry to the people of the world.

God has given us two hands—one to receive with and the other to give with. We are not cisterns made for hoarding; we are channels made for sharing. (Billy Graham).





A BRANCH RAISED UP

A Worship Series on Redemption and Bearing Fruit

Week One highlights Jeremiah 33:15 - "I will cause a righteous branch to spring up" - and relates that verse to Christ who came to raise up our fallen race by covering us with His righteousness so that we might be saved and grow in Him. We have a Savior who is our Righteousness.

Week Two highlights 1 Peter 2:24 - "He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree" - and focuses on Christ, who came to die on the tree of the cross that we might grow in faith freely forgiven. We have a Savior who was crucified that we might live as plantings of the Lord forevermore.

Week Three highlights John 15:5 - "I am the vine; you are the branches" - and focuses on the connection we have with Christ, who gives us the support and nourishment we need to branch out in our service for Him. We have a Savior who serves as the base from which our faith flourishes.

Week Four highlights Revelation 2:7 - "To the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God" - and focuses on the rich and fruitful life of heaven that awaits all who have been washed in the blood of the Lamb. We have a Savior who is preparing a place for us to live with Him forever.

A Branch Raised Up

LOVING PEOPLE

Charlie Brown's young friend Linus made the mistake of confessing to his big sister Lucy that he wanted to be a doctor when he grew up. Lucy was astounded at her brother's declaration. "You, a doctor! That's a laugh! You could never be a doctor! You know why? Because you don't love humankind!"

Young Linus immediately responded, "I do love humankind! It's people I can't stand!"

Linus' comment may give us a chuckle. We find humor in it because we identify with Linus. Apart from the power of God's Spirit working in us, our love for others is weak and shallow at best. But God calls us to love all people and enables us to do so. Whether we are factory workers, doctors, carpenters, policemen, teachers, secretaries, or plumbers, we are to love those whom we work with as well as all people. God places us in different vocations where we can share God's love. We are His instruments through which He works.

In his letter to the church in Corinth, the Apostle Paul wrote, "Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to Him and to which God has called him" (1 Cor. 7:17). God has a purpose, a plan, in mind for each of us. Like Linus, one might consider being a doctor, but God may have a much different vocation in mind. No vocation is to be viewed higher or lower than another, and we are called, regardless of where we are placed by God, to let His love within us overflow to others.







PRODUCE TABLE



A table will be set up in the coat room throughout the summer for anyone wishing to bring in their extra garden produce to share with members of the congregation.

The idea is to assist those who have too much or not enough fresh garden items.
