GREETINGS IN THE NAME OF JESUS!

Even though America is becoming more and more secular, the most recent Gallup Poll indicates that 77 percent of the people in America still identify with Christianity. Gallup also reports that 40 percent of our citizens attend church, although not necessarily on a weekly basis.

The purpose of this article is to help you understand that there is a difference from being a church member, even one who attends church regularly, and being a disciple for Jesus. Many members are on a spiritual journey to becoming disciples but are not there yet. A church member could be seen as a person who has more of a relationship with the congregation rather than with Jesus. Members are much more comfortable talking about church activities than how Jesus is active in their lives. Being a member isn't a bad thing, but Jesus wants more for us than just attending church. Disciples are followers of Jesus and learners from Him and their primary relationship is with Jesus. The goal of disciples is to help make more disciples. Their desire is focused on sharing the Gospel and serving others rather than discussing or complaining about the pastor, staff, and/or the church.

The following may help you see some of the distinctions between the thoughts and attitudes of members and those of disciples:

- 1. Members give money to support others who do ministry. Disciples also give to support others, but they are also personally involved in ministry. They see themselves in partnership and believe that ministry belongs to all God's people.
- 2. The focus of the members is to maintain the institution. Members give to maintain the church because the building needs to be heated, lighted, and maintained. They want to make sure that committees are staffed and Sunday school is taught. Disciples give for these reasons as well and also see giving as part of a growing relationship with Jesus and a means to reach out to others with the Gospel.
- 3. Members are happy just to attend church without any additional commitment. Disciples get involved in using their time, talents, and money to help extend God's kingdom.

In the life of disciples, the mission field begins as they leave the parking lot of the church. Take note of the signs the next time you leave the church parking lot! Disciples will daily spend time in prayer and reading God's Word. They will attend church weekly, grow in the grace of giving,



serve others, and share the Good News of Jesus love with others. May God help us all become His disciples so we can be His channels of love, grace, and mercy to those in our midst.

Mark of a True Disciple





Putting on the New Self

A theme the Apostle Paul returns to often throughout his letters in the New Testament is that of putting off the Old Adam and putting on the New Self. Get rid of those things that are a hindrance to your life in Christ. "Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that



Stewards Transformed by Grace, Faith, and Love

The theme for this year's stewardship emphasis is titled **Stewards Transformed by Grace**, **Faith, and Love.** We will begin this emphasis on September 28 & October 2. As God's people, we have been given the high honor of being His stewards. As His stewards, we are called to manage faithfully all that we've been entrusted with according to God's will and benefit. Because of God's generous gifts of grace, faith, and love, we can accomplish all that God asks us to do. God works in and through us as we become His hands, feet, and mouth. Each week during this three-week emphasis, we will be focusing on one of the three virtues, grace, faith, and love.

In week one, our focus is on God's undeserved kindness and love which the Bible calls grace. God's grace comes from God through Jesus and His work for us. It's not something we have a right to. Jesus obtained it for us. We get it freely because of the obedience and sacrifice of Jesus. This saving



grace also enables and motivates us to be God's stewards. The power of God's grace in our lives compels us to use our time, talents, and money in ways that glorify God.


In week two, we're reminded that it's through faith that we have access into God's grace and a new relationship with Him. Through faith, God changes us, and we are born anew of Him. Not only does faith justify us and give us peace with God (Romans 5:1), we are told by James and other writers that faith produces works (James 2:18). Faith leads to action. Through faith, we're empowered to fulfill God's purposes. Our deeds as stewards are evidence of our faith.

The third week we will focus on the virtue of love. Love ought to follow faith. Love seeks the welfare of others. "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and His love is perfected in us" (1 John 4:11-12). God's love in Christ will compel us to do things that appear foolish to unbelievers. God's love prompts us to give freely of our time, talents, and treasures to help others and extend His kingdom.

I hope and pray that God will use the sermon messages on **Stewards Transformed by Grace, Faith, and Love** to draw you closer to Him. I also urge you to make every effort to attend the Bible studies as we focus on grace, faith, and love.

Also, you're not going to want to miss the first week as a **free gift** will be given to everyone in attendance.

Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into his presence with singing!


