## For Advent 4: December 20, 2020

A rocket took off from Cape Canaveral last month, transporting astronauts to the International Space Station. Before ignition, Mission Control called out the countdown: *Ten* . . . *nine* . . . *eight* . . .

In a passage to be read in our church on Sunday, an angel put a young girl named Mary on a countdown. He said, "You will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus."

The importance of any countdown lies in the event at its end. You can say *three*...*two*... *one* before you fly a kite. Still, the countdown before a rocket liftoff is more important than the same numbers being called out on a windy day in the park.

At the end of Mary's countdown would come the birth of the One "called the Son of the Most High," the angel said. "And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." This was important.

But how? Mary was a virgin. Answer: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you" (Luke 1:31, 32-33, 35). A countdown takes on high significance *for you* when you have a personal stake in the event at hand. The stakes ran high for Mary. She would be the Mother of God.

Yet the Christmas countdown also anticipates the greatest of all blessings for you, and for all people. The Savior of the nations comes!

Miraculously, Mary believed. Whenever people believe this message, that is also by the Holy Spirit's power.

God bless your Christmas countdown!
